Dublin West needs Proper Planning



More than many parts of the country, North and West Dublin has suffered the consequences of corrupt, inappropriate planning. Since being elected to Fingal County Council, Patrick Nulty has an unblemished record of protecting our precious green belt and standing up to NAMA-bound developers and the Fianna Fáil - Fine Gael rezoning coalition.

Cllr Nulty voted against reckless planning decisions in Tyrellstown, Fosterstown and Oldtown-Moortown.

Local people should never be held hostage by property speculators for school sites or local amenities. The next government must ensure that NAMA delivers a social dividend and that ghost estates are made safe or put to good use. No more land should be re-zoned while demand for property is on the floor.

Labour in government will take action to control property speculation and ensure the planning process is community centred, not developer-led.

Education: Key to a Better Future

We must focus on early education, life-long learning and basic literacy and numeracy. These are the building blocks of tomorrow's education system.

There should be no more prefabs – building new schools will provide jobs for construction workers on the dole and help ensure the next generation gets the education they deserve.

My priorities include new, permanent buildings for Luttrellstown Community College, Mulhuddart National School, and Tyrellstown Educate Together.

Getting Ireland Working Again

1,000 Irish people are emigrating every week. Families are being torn apart by Fianna Fail's disastrous economic policies.

Nowhere has been hit harder by the recession than West and North Dublin. Today, 1 in 4 local young people can't find a job. People are struggling to get by on reduced incomes as the cost of heating homes, buying petrol and doing the weekly shop rises relentlessly.

The key to recovery is getting people back to work. We need to invest in the future and give people the skills they need for the jobs they want. Labour in government will put job creation front-and-centre of everything we do. We will:
