CLONDALKIN.

CLONDALKIN, an inland parish and village, partly in Newcastle, but chiefly in Uppercross barony, Dublin county, $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles S.W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 4,777 acres, of which 44 are in the village. Population, 2,430; of village, 474, inhabiting 89 houses. It is situated near the ninth lock of the Grand Canal, and close to the line of the Great Southern and Western Railway, of which it is the first station from Dublin. It was anciently named Cluain-Dolcan, and by the Danes Dun-awley. The village consists chiefly of one irregular street, of small but neatly built houses and cottages. The only public buildings are the Parish Church, a small plain modern building, and a neat Roman Catholic Chapel. It has Almshouses for destitute widows, a Dorcas Institution, Lying-in Hospital, and Dispensary, a Parochial and two National Schools, and a Constabulary Police Station. The ancient round tower is the nearest structure of the kind to the metropolis, and is in good preservation. It stands 100 feet high, and is 15 feet in diameter, covered with a conical roof of stone.

CLONSKEAGH, OR CLONSKEA.

CLONSKEAGH, a village in the parish of St. Mary's, Donnybrook, barony and county of Dublin, three miles S. from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 63 acres. Population, 310, inhabiting 54 houses. It is situated on the river Dodder, and on the road to Enniskerry. It contains two hammer-smith iron works. The neighbourhood is studded with gentlemen's seats and neat villas. *Vergemount* is a pretty range of houses close to the village. *Roebuck*, a district half a mile further on, is covered with elegant mansions and demesnes, the principal of which is the castle of that name, the seat of E. P. Westby, esq. *Milltown* is less than half a mile to the right of Clonskeagh, in the parish of Milltown, Uppercross barony, and comprises an area of 185 acres. Population 863, inhabiting 132 houses. It contains a small Church, dedicated to St. Philip, and a small Roman Catholic Chapel. The Parish Church is situate at St. Mary's, Simmonscourt, Donnybrook. Three omnibuses ply to Clonskeagh from Dublin several times a day.

LOUGHLINSTOWN.

LOUGHLINSTOWN, a small village, partly in Killiney and Rathmichael parishes, Rathdown barony, Dublin county, $\frac{3}{4}$ miles S.S.E. from Dublin, containing a few straggling houses and cabins, to the left of which is Loughlinstown House, the residence of Henry West, q.c. On crossing Loughlinstown green, to the right, on the brow of the hill, stands the Rathdown Union Workhouse, very prettily and most salubriously situated on a site of eight acres, erected in 1841 at an expense of £6,000.

LUCAN.

LUCAN, an inland town and parish in Newcastle barony, Dublin county, seven miles W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 1,126 acres. Population of parish, 1,009. It is the property of the Colthurst Vesey family. The town is prettily situated in a fertile vale, on the south bank of the River Liffey, which is here crossed by a granite bridge of one arch, and consists of one wide angular street of small but neat houses and cottages, most of which are let in summer to visitors and invalids. Its public buildings are, the Parish Church, a neat structure with a tower and spire, a large new Roman Catholic Chapel, and a Wesleyan Chapel. It has a Dispensary and a Loan Fund; a Lending Library, Church, and National Schools. It is a Chief Constabulary Police Station, and Petty Sessions are held every alternate Tuesday. In the grounds of Weston park is the well-known and much-frequented waterfall, called the "Salmon Leap," which consists of a succession of rocky ledges on the Liffey, over which the fish dart at one bound. It forms a beautiful cascade, the picturesque effect of which is greatly increased by the rich and lofty wooded banks of the river, and the adjoining tastefully embellished demesne of Leixlip Castle.

MALAHIDE.

MALAHIDE, a maritime town and parish in Coolock barony, Dublin county, nine miles N. from Dublin, comprising an area of 1,126 acres. Population, 1,341. The town is situated on a narrow inlet of the sea, and on the Drogheda railway, of which it forms the fourth station from Dublin. The Castle is a large square building, flanked by lofty circular towers, and stands on a high limestone rock, commanding a fine view of the town and bay. Of the original Castle little remains but the site, and that has been greatly enlarged and improved by the present Lord Talbot de Malahide; the principal front is embattled, and the main entrance, which is under a splendid Gothic porch, is defended by two circular towers. The grand hall is roofed with richly-carved ancient Irish oak, lighted by three large windows, with a gallery at the end. Among the many splendid apartments the Castle contains, the most curious is that called the "oak chamber," ceiled and wainscotted with richly-carved oak, in compartments, containing scriptural devices, and lighted with a pointed window of stained glass. In the drawing-room, among other valuable paintings, there is a small altar-piece painted by Albert Durer, said to have been originally in the oratory of Mary Queen of Scots, at Holyrood House. The demesne is adorned with groups of stately trees, and the grounds and gardens of the Castle are beautifully laid out. It is open daily to visitors. The town contains many handsome cottages, which are chiefly let in summer to visitors for sea bathing. The only public buildings are the Church, a neat edifice of the later English style, and a handsome Roman Catholic Chapel. It has a Constabulary Police and a Coast-guard Station. Off the coast there are profitable beds of oysters, the property of the Lord of the Manor.

MERRION (PEMBROKE TOWNSHIP).

MERRION, a village in the parish of St. Mary, Donnybrook, Dublin barony and county, three miles S.E. by S. from the G.P.O., Dublin; comprising an area of 197 acres. Population, 725. It is situated on the road to Kingstown and Bray, and fronts the strand of the bay of Dublin, which is here crossed by the Kingstown railway. The houses are mostly let in lodgings in the summer to sea bathers. Along the road to the Blackrock, and in the neighbourhood around, there are various pretty seats and villas, among which are Elm-park, Bloomfield, Merriem-hall, and Merriem Castle, in the grounds of which latter are the ivied ruins of the castle of the ancient proprietors. The parish Church is situate at St. Mary's, Simmons-court, Donnybrook.

PALMERSTOWN.

PALMERSTOWN, or PALMERSTON, a parish and village in Uppercross barony, Dublin county, five miles west from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 1,518 acres. Population of the parish, 1,511. It is situated on the river Liffey and road to Lucan, and contains large cotton mills, iron and lead works, and oil and dye-stuff mills. The village consists of small humble dwellings, irregularly built, a Roman Catholic chapel, and Constabulary Police station. The Great Southern and Western line of railway passes through the parish. In the vicinity there are several handsome seats and villas, the principal of which is Palmerstown House, a seat of the Earl of Donoughmore, erected by his ancestor, the Right Hon. T. H. Hutchinson, when Secretary for Ireland. It is a spacious mansion in an elevated situation, commanding fine views. In the Irish peerage this place gives the title of Viscount Palmerston to the Right Hon. Henry John Temple. A fair for horses and cattle, well frequented, takes place on 21st August.

RATHCOOLE, &c.

RATHCOOLE, an inland town and parish in Newcastle barony, Dublin county, 10 miles S.W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 4,705 acres. Population, 1,356. The town, which was anciently called "Radcul," is situated upon the road to Naas, and consists of one street, about a quarter of a mile in length, chiefly of small houses and cabins, irregularly built. The only public building is the Parish Church, a neat plain edifice. It has a Dispensary. It is the head station of the Constabulary force of the district of Uppercross. About two miles and a half N.W. from Rathcoole is the parish and village of *Newcastle*, comprising an area of 4,263 acres. Population, 1,108. It is situated on the Grand Canal. The village was formerly a borough, having a portrieve and burgesses under charter of James I., and prior to the Union, sent two members to the Irish parliament. The Church is an ancient picturesque edifice, covered with ivy, having a fine eastern window. The Roman Catholic Chapel is a neat building, with a belfry. There is a Dispensary and National Schools; and Petty Sessions are held there every alternate Friday.

RATHFARNHAM.

RATHFARNHAM, a parish and village in Uppercross and Rathdown baronies, Dublin county, four miles south from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 2,531 acres. Population, 5,355. It is situated on the road to Whitechurch, and near where the Military-road commences that crosses the mountains into Wicklow county. The village consists of one long irregular street: the Church on the right side, with a tower and spire. The Chapel is a large building. The Loretto Convent, in the vicinity is a large modern brick building, attached to which there is an elegant chapel, a female free school, also a ladies' boarding and day school. There is also at *Pirhouse* a Carmelite Convent, also a Dispensary, a Petty Sessions Court-house, and District Constabulary Police Station. A fair is held on July 10. The bridge of Rathfarnham, over the river Dodder, is several hundred yards from the village, the approach to which is rising ground, thickly shaded in summer by the trees of the demesnes on each side. The neighbourhood abounds in pretty seats and villas, commanding rich views of the Dublin mountains and bay. The castle of Rathfarnham was built by Archbishop Loftus in the reign of Elizabeth. One of the entrances to the demesne, fronting the Dodder, is in the style of a Roman triumphal arch. The entrance to the castle is by a portico of eight Doric columns that support a dome painted in fresco with the signs of the zodiac. *Ballyboden*, a village in the parish of Whitechurch, is about one and a quarter miles farther on, and comprises an area of two acres. Population, 252.

TALLAGHT.

TALLAGHT, an inland town and parish in Uppercross barony, Dublin county, seven miles S.W. by W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 21,868 acres. Population of parish, 4,921; of town, 348, inhabiting 57 houses. The town is situated on the road to Blessington, and the parish extends from Balrothery hill on the river Dodder, to the Green hills at its western extremity. The southern portion forms the range called the Tallaght Hills, and commands magnificent views of the bay and vale of Dublin. The church, a little above the town, dedicated to St. Maelruen, is a modern building in the pointed style. At Firhouse there is a convent of Discalced Carmelites, and at Mount Anne a small monastery of the same order, in both of which free schools are held. In the town there is a Dispensary, and there are National Schools. It is a Constabulary Police station, and Petty Sessions are held every alternate Monday. There are several paper and flour mills in the parish, as also a woollen mill.
