CLONDALKIN, an inland parish and village, partly in Newcastle, but chiefly in Uppercross barony, Dublin county, 4½ miles S.W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 4,777 acres, of which 44 are in the village. Population, 2,430; of village, 474, inhabiting 89 houses. It is situated near the ninth lock of the Grand Canal, and close to the line of the Great Southern and Western Railway, of which it is the first station from Dublin. It was anciently named Cluain-Dolcan, and by the Danes Dun-awley. The village consists chiefly of one irregular street, of small but neatly built houses and cottages. The only public buildings are the Parish Church, a small plain modern building, and a neat Roman Catholic Chapel. It has Almshouses for destitute widows, a Dorcas Institution, Lying-in Hospital, and Dispensary, a Parochial and two National Schools, and a Constabulary Police Station. The ancient round tower is the nearest structure of the kind to the metropolis, and is in good preservation. It stands 100 feet high, and is 15 feet in diameter, covered with a conical roof of stone.

CLONSKEAGH.

CLONSKEAGH, a village in the parish of St. Mary's, Donnybrook, barony and county of Dublin, three miles S. from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 68 acres. There is a male and female National school. Population, 310, inhabiting 54 houses. It is situated on the river Dodder, and on the road to Enniskerry. It contains two hammer-smith iron works. The neighbourhood is studded with gentlemen's seats and neat villas. *Vergemount* is a pretty range of houses close to the village. *Roeluck*, a district half a mile further on, is covered with elegant mansions and demesnes, the principal of which is the castle of that name, the seat of

LUCAN.

LUCAN, an inland town and parish in Newcastle barony, Dublin county, seven miles W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 1,126 acres. Population of parish, 1,009. It is partly the property of the Colthurst Vesey family, and partly the property of the representatives of the late J. Gandon, esq. The town is prettily situated in a fertile vale, on the south bank of the River Liffey, which is here crossed by a stone bridge of one arch, and consists of one wide angular street of small but neat houses and cottages, most of which are let in summer to visitors and invalids. Its public buildings are, the Parish Church, a neat structure with a tower and spire, a large new Roman Catholic Chapel, a Sisters of Mercy Convent, and a Wesleyan Chapel. It has a Dispensary and a Loan Fund; a Lending Library, Church, and National Schools. It is a Chief Constabulary Police Station, and Petty Sessions are held every alternate Tuesday. In the grounds of Weston Park is the well-known and much-frequented waterfall, called the Salmon Leap; which consists of a succession of rocky ledges on the Liffey, over which the fish dart at one bound. It forms a beautiful cascade, the picturesque effect of which is greatly increased by the rich and lofty wooded banks of the river, and the adjoining tastefully embellished demesne of Leixlip Castle.

MALAHIDE.

MALAHIDE, a maritime town and parish in Coolock barony, Dublin county, nine miles N. from Dublin, comprising an area of 1,126 acres. Population, 1,341. The town is situated on a narrow inlet of the sea, and on the Drogheda railway, of which it forms the fourth station from Dublin. The Castle is a large square building, flanked by lofty circular towers, and stands on a high limestone rock, commanding a fine view of the town and bay. Of the original Castle little remains but the site, and that has been greatly enlarged and improved by the present Lord Talbot de Malahide; the principal front is embattled, and the main entrance, which is under a splendid Gothic porch, is defended by two circular towers. The grand hall is roofed with richly-carved ancient Irish oak, lighted by three large windows, with a gallery at the end. Among the many splendid apartments the Castle contains, the most curious is that called the "oak chamber," ceiled and wainscotted with richly-carved oak, in compartments, containing scriptural devices, and lighted with a pointed window of

PALMERSTOWN, or PALMERSTON, a parish and village in Uppercross barony, Dublin county, five miles west from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 1,518 acres. Population of the parish, 1,511. It is situated on the river Liffey and road to Lucan, and contains large cotton mills, iron and lead works, and oil and dye-stuff mills. The village consists of small humble dwellings, irregularly built, a Roman Catholic chapel, and Constabulary Police station. The Great Southern and Western line of railway passes through the parish. In the vicinity there are several handsome seats and villas, the principal of which is Palmerstown House, a seat of the Earl of Donoughmore, erected by his ancestor, the Right Hon. T. H. Hutchinson, when Secretary for Ireland. It is a spacious mansion in an elevated situation, commanding fine views. A fair for horses and cattle, well frequented, takes place on 21st August.

RATHCOOLE AND SAGGARD.

RATHCOOLE, an inland town and parish in Newcastle barony, Dublin county, 10 miles S.W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 4,705 acres. Population, 1,356. The town, which was anciently called Radcuill, is situated upon the road to Naas, and consists of one street, about a quarter of a mile in length, chiefly of small houses and cabins, irregularly built. The only public building is the Parish Church, a neat plain edifice. It has a Dispensary. It is the head station of the Constabulary force of the district of Uppercross. About two miles and a half N.W. from Rathcoole is the parish and village of *Newcastle*, comprising an area of 4,283 acres. Population, 1,108. It is situated on the Grand Canal. The village was formerly a borough, having a portrieve and burgesses under charter of James I., and prior to the Union, sent two members to the Irish parliament. The Church is an ancient picturesque edifice, covered with ivy, having a fine eastern window. The Roman Catholic Chapel is a neat building, with a belfry. There is a Dispensary and National Schools. Petty Sessions are held every alternate Friday.

RATHFARNHAM.

RATHFARNHAM, a parish and village in Uppercross and Rathdown baronies, Dublin county, four miles south from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 2,581 acres. Population, 5,555. It is situated on the road to Whitechurch, and near where the Military-road commences that crosses the mountains into Wicklow county. The village consists of one long irregular street: the Church on the right side, with a tower and spire. The Chapel is a large building. The Loretto Convent, in the vicinity is a large modern brick building, attached to which there is an elegant chapel, a female free school, also a ladies' boarding and day school. There is also at *Firhouse* a Carmelite Convent, also a Dispensary, a Petty Sessions Court-house, and District Constabulary Police Station. A fair is held on July 10. The bridge of Rathfarnham, over the river Dodder, is several hundred yards from the village, the approach to which is rising ground, thickly shaded in summer by the trees of the demesnes on each side. The neighbourhood abounds in pretty seats and villas, commanding rich views of the Dublin mountains and bay. The castle of Rathfarnham was built by Archbishop Loftus in the reign of Elizabeth. One of the entrances to the demesne, fronting the Dodder, is in the style of a Roman triumphal arch. The entrance to the castle is by a portico of eight Doric columns that support a dome painted in fresco with the signs of the zodiac. *Ballyboden*, a village in the parish of Whitechurch, is about one and a quarter miles farther on, and comprises an area of two acres. Population, 252.

RINGSEND (PEMBROKE TOWNSHIP).

RINGSEND, a maritime village in the parish of St. Mary's, Donnybrook, Dublin barony and county, 2 miles east from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 54 acres. Population, 1,931. It is situated near Irishtown, upon the eastern bank of the river Dodder, at its confluence with the Liffey and tidal estuary of the harbour, also on the road to Sandymount, the Pigeon-house fort, and Light-house. The name is said to have been originally RIN-AUN, i.e. appropriately, "the point of the tide." Until a very late period it and the Pigeon-house fort, to which a mole called the South wall extends from the village 17,754 feet into the bay, was the chief landing and embarking place of Dublin. It consists of several streets of very indifferent and irregularly built houses, chiefly poor, and many dilapidated. Close to the village, on the western side of the Dodder, are the Grand Canal Docks, comprising an area of 25 acres, with 2,000 yards of quayage, and from 17 to 18 feet depth of water. They have 3 spacious graving docks, and are entered from the channel by two wide gates, called the Camden and Buckingham locks. It has glass and salt works. Ship and boat building is carried on to a small extent. There is an iron foundry, where iron boats, steam engines, boilers, &c. are made. It contains a Wesleyan Methodist Chapel, a Roman Catholic Chapel, and National School. Cars from and to College-street ply constantly.

TALLAGHT.

TALLAGHT, an inland town and parish in Uppercross barony, Dublin county, seven miles S. W. by W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 21,868 acres. Population of parish, 4,921; of town, 348, inhabiting 57 houses. The town is situated on the road to Blessington, and the parish extends from Balrothery hill on the river Dodder, to the Green hills at its western extremity. The southern portion forms the range called the Tallaght Hills, and commands magnificent views of the bay and vale of Dublin. The church, a little above the town, dedicated to St. Maelrune, is a modern building in the pointed style. At Firhouse there is a convent of Discalced Carmelites, and at Mount Anne a small monastery of the same order, in both of which free schools are held. There are several paper and flour mills in the parish, as also a woollen mill.
