CHAPELIZOD.

CHAPELIZOD, a village partly in Palmerstown parish, Uppercross barony, but chiefly in the parish of the same name, Castleknock barony, Dublin county, three miles W. from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 63 acres. Population, 1,280, inhabiting 255 houses. It is partly situate on the river Liffey, on the high road to Galway, and near to the Great Southern and Western line of Railway. It is said to derive its name from *La belle Isod*, daughter of *King Aengus*. King William III. spent several days in it; and prior to the erection of the Viceregal lodge, it was the country residence of the Viceroy. Its buildings are, a Church, with an ivied tower, a Convent at Mount Sackville, where over 60 boarders and over 100 day pupils attend, a Roman Catholic Church, a Dispensary, a National School, and Metropolitan Police Station, also Postal and Telegraph Office. Electric tramway starts from Conyngham-road.

CLONDALKIN.

CLONDALKIN, an inland parish and village, partly in Newcastle, but chiefly in Uppercross barony, Dublin county, 4½ miles S.W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 4,777 acres, of which 44 are in the village. Population, 2,179; of village, 470, inhabiting 88 houses. It is situated near the ninth lock of the Grand Canal, and close to the line of the Great Southern and Western Railway, of which it is the first station from Dublin. It was anciently

named Cluain-Dolcan, and by the Danes Dun-awley. The village consists chiefly of one irregular street, of small but neatly built houses and cottages. The only public buildings are the Parish Church, a small plain modern building, and a neat Roman Catholic Church. It has Almshouses for destitute widows, a Dorcas Institution, Lying-in Hospital, and Dispensary, a Parochial and two National Schools, and a Constabulary Police Station. The ancient round tower is the nearest structure of the kind to the metropolis, and is in good preservation. It stands 100 feet high, and is 15 feet in diameter, covered with a conical roof of stone.

CLONSKEAGH (PEMBROKE TOWNSHIP).

CLONSKEAGH, a village in the parish of St. Mary's, Donnybrook, barony and county of Dublin, three miles S. from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 68 acres. There is a male and female National school. Population, 310, inhabiting 54 houses. It is situated on the river Dodder, and on the road to Enniskerry. It contains two hammer-smith iron works. The neighbourhood is studded with gentlemen's seats and villas, the principal of which is Clonskeagh castle, the seat of Capt. Robert Wade Thompson. *Vergemount* is a pretty range of houses close to the village. *Roebuck*, a district half a mile further on, is covered with elegant mansions and demesnes, of which the castle of that name, the seat of E. P. Westby, esq., is conspicuous. *Milltown* is less than half a mile to the right of Clonskeagh, in the parish of Milltown, Uppercross barony, and comprises an area of 185 acres. Population 363, inhabiting 132 houses. The Church of St. Philip, which has recently been erected, is situate at Temple-road, Rathmines, adjoining the Milltown railway station. There is a small Roman Catholic Church. The Parish Church is situate at St. Mary's, Simmonscourt, Donnybrook. Electric trams run to Clonskeagh from Sackville-street *via* Leeson-street. There are four deliveries of letters daily from the Rathmines District Post Office.

LOUGHLINSTOWN, a small village, partly in Killiney and Rathmichael parishes, Rathdown barony, Dublin county, 8¼ miles S.S.E. from Dublin, containing a few straggling houses and cabins, to the left of which is Loughlinstown House, the residence of Major Domville, J.F. On crossing Loughlinstown green, to the right, on the brow of the hill, stands the Rathdown Union Workhouse, very prettily and most salubriously situated on a site of eight acres, erected in 1841 at an expense of £6,000. The village of Loughlinstown form part of the Township of Killiney and Ballybrack.

LUCAN.

LUCAN, an inland town and parish in Newcastle barony, Dublin county, seven miles W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 1,126 acres. Population, 872. It is partly the property of the Colthurst Vesey family, and partly the property of J. F. Shackleton, esq., who have purchased the Petty Canon lands from the representatives of the late J. Ganon, esq. The town is prettily situated in a fertile vale, on the banks of the River Liffey, which is here crossed by a stone bridge of one arch, and consists of one wide angular street of small but neat houses and cottages, many of which are let in summer to visitors and invalids. Its public buildings are, the Parish Church, a neat structure with a tower and spire, a large Roman Catholic Church, a Sisters of Mercy Convent, a Wesleyan Methodist Church, and a Presbyterian Church and a Manse. It has a Dispensary, a Lending Library, Church, Rectory, National Schools, and a Parochial Hall. It is a Chief Constabulary Police Station, and Petty Sessions are held every alternate Monday. In the grounds of Weston Park and Leixlip Castle is the well-known and much-frequented waterfall, called the Salmon Leap, which consists of a succession of rocky ledges crossing the Liffey, over which the fish dart at one bound. It forms a beautiful cascade, the picturesque effect of which is greatly increased by the rich and lofty wooded banks of the river, and the adjoining tastefully embellished demesne of Leixlip Castle. The Lucan spa is much frequented by visitors and invalids. A beautiful and capacious new hotel and sanatorium has been completed by the "Lucan Hydropathic Spa Co., Limited," and is generally crowded with visitors. There is an electric railway from Dublin, Conyngham-road, to Lucan.

PALMERSTOWN.

PALMERSTOWN, or PALMERSTON, a parish and village in Uppercross barony, Dublin county, five miles west from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 1,518 acres. Population of the parish, 1,511. It is situated on the river Liffey and road to Lucan. The village consists of small humble dwellings, irregularly built, a Roman Catholic chapel, and Constabulary Police station. The Great Southern and Western line of railway passes through the parish. In the vicinity there are several handsome seats and villas, the principal of which is Palmerstown House, a former seat of the Earl of Donoughmore, erected by his ancestor the Right Hon. T. H. Hutchinson, when Secretary for Ireland. It is now occupied by the Stewart Institution. It is a spacious mansion on an elevated situation, commanding fine views. A fair for horses and cattle, well frequented, takes place on 21st August. There is now an electric tramway which starts from Conyngham-road and runs to Lucan and Leixlip.

RATHCOOLE AND SAGGARD.

RATHCOOLE, an inland town and parish in Newcastle barony, Dublin county, 10 miles S. W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 4,705 acres. Population, 271. The town, which was anciently called Radcull, is situated upon the road to Naas, and consists of one street, about a quarter of a mile in length, chiefly of small houses and cabins, irregularly built. The only public building is the Parish Church, a neat plain edifice. It has a Dispensary. It is the head station of the Constabulary force of the district of Uppercross. About two miles and a half N. W. from Rathcoole is the parish and village of *Newcastle*, comprising an area of 4,283 acres. Population, 1,108. It is situated on the Grand Canal. The village was formerly a borough, having a portrieve and burgesses under charter of James I., and prior to the Union, sent two members to the Irish parliament. The Church is an ancient picturesque edifice, covered with ivy, having a fine eastern window, The Roman Catholic Church is a neat building, with a belfry. There is a Dispensary and National Schools. Petty Sessions are held the first Friday in each month. There is a Postal Telegraph Office at the Post Office.

RATHFARNHAM.

RATHFARNHAM, a parish and village in Uppercross and Rathdown baronies, Dublin county, four miles south from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 2,581 acres. Population, 9,208. It is situated on the road to Whitechurch, and near where the Military-road commences that crosses the mountains into Wicklow county. The village consists of one long irregular street: the Church on the right side, with a tower and spire. The Roman Catholic Church is a large building. The Loretto Convent, in the vicinity, is a modern building, attached to which there is an elegant chapel, a female free school, also a ladies' boarding and day school. The Novitiate College of the Augustinians and St. Columba's College are in the neighbourhood. There is also a Dispensary, a Petty Sessions Court-house, and Constabulary Police Station. Three fairs are held in the year—May 15, July 10, October 7. The bridge of Rathfarnham, over the river Dodder, is several hundred yards from the village, the approach to which is rising ground, thickly shaded in summer by the trees of the demesnes on each side. The neighbourhood abounds in pretty seats and villas, commanding rich views of the Dublin mountains and bay. At Grange is situated the "Priory," the residence of the famous John Philpot Curran. The castle of Rathfarnham was built by Archbishop Loftus in the reign of Elizabeth. One of the entrances to the demesne, fronting the Dodder, is in the style of a Roman triumphal arch. The entrance to the castle is by a portico of eight Doric columns that support a dome painted in fresco with the signs of the zodiac. *Ballyboden*, a village in the parish of Whitechurch, is about one and a quarter miles farther on, and comprises an area of two acres. Population, 252. There is a Postal Telegraph Office at the Post Office.

TALLAGHT.

TALLAGHT, an inland village and parish in Uppercross barony, Dublin county, seven miles S.W. by W. from G.P.O. Dublin, comprising an area of 21,868 acres. Population of parish, 4,921; of town, 312, inhabiting 57 houses. The town is situated on the road to Blessington, and the parish extends from the village of Templeogue to Crumlin, and on its southern side to Balrothery hill on the river Dodder, to the Green hills at its western extremity. The southern portion forms the range called the Tallaght Hill, and commands magnificent views of the bay and vale of Dublin. The church, a little above the town, dedicated to St. Maelruine, is a modern building in the pointed style. At Firhouse there is a convent of Discalced Carmelites, and in the village is the Priory of the Dominican order at St. Mary's, where a beautiful Memorial Church has been erected to the memory of the Very Rev. Thomas Burke. In the town there is a Dispensary, and there are National Schools. It is a Constabulary Police station, and Petty Sessions are held every alternate Monday. There is a Postal Telegraph at the Post Office. Mr. Robert Boardman's paper mill at Boldbrook is in the vicinity. The cars of the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway Co. running between Terenure and Blessington, pass through Tallaght, which is a station on the line now running to Poulaphuca, a most interesting and charming line of country opened up by the enterprise of the Steam Tramway Company.
