CLONDALKIN.

CLONDALKIN, an inland parish and village, partly in Newcastle, but chiefly in Uppercross barony, Dublin county, 4½ miles S. W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 4,777 acres, of which 44 are in the village. Population, 2,179; of village, 271, inhabiting 64 houses. It is situated near the ninth lock of the Grand Canal, and close to the line of the Great Southern and Western Railway, of which it is the first station from Dublin. It was anciently named Cluain-Dolcan, and by the Danes Dun-awley. The village consists chiefly of one irregular street, of small but neatly built houses and cottages. The only public buildings are the Parish Church, a small plain modern building, a neat Roman Catholic Church, and a Public Library, erected through the munificence of Mr. Andrew Carnegie in 1910. It has Almshouses for destitute widows, a Dorcas Institution, Lying-in Hospital, and Dispensary, a Parochial and two National Schools, and a Constabulary Police Station. The ancient round tower is the nearest structure of the kind to the metropolis, and is in good preservation. It stands 100 feet high, and is 15 feet in diameter, covered with a conical roof of stone.

CLONTARF AND DOLLYMOUNT,

AMALGAMATED WITH THE CITY OF DUBLIN BY ACT OF PARLIAMENT, 1900-FOR STREETS see CITY OF DUBLIN.

CLONTARF, a maritime parish and formerly a township in Coolock barony, Dublin county, three miles E.N.E from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 1,289 acres, of which 38 are occupied by the "sheds" of Clontari. It is a memorable place in Irish history, as the scene of a great battle fought by King Brian Boromh, or Boru, on Good Friday, 1014, that put an end to the Danish power in Ireland, the details of which are variously and diffusively narrated by the native historians, and form, it is said the subject of Gray's ode of the "Fatal Sisters." LUCAN, an inland town and parish in Newcastle barony, Dublin county, seven miles W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 1,126 acres. Population, 919. It is partly the property of the Colthurst Vesey family, and partly the property of J. F. Shackleton, esq., who have purchased the Petty Canon lands from the representatives of the late J. Ganon, esq. The town is prettily situated in a fertile vale, on the banks of the River Liffey, which is here crossed by a fine stone bridge of one arch. The older portion of the town consists of one wide angular street of small but neat houses; there is also a number of fine residential houses in the neighbourhood. Its public buildings are, the Church of Ireland, a neat structure with a tower and spire, a large Roman Catholic Church, a Presentation Convent, a Methodist Church and Manse. and a Presbyterian Church and Manse. It has a Dispensary, a Lending Library, Church, Rectory, National Schools, and a Parochial Hall. It is a Chief Constabulary Police Station, and Petty Sessions are held every alternate Monday. In the grounds of Weston Lodge and Leixlip Castle is the well-known and much frequented waterfail, called the Salmon Leap, which consists of a succession of rocky ledges crossing the Liffey, over which the fish dart at one bound. It forms a beautiful cascade, the picturesque effect of which is greatly increased by the rich and lofty wooded banks of the river, and the adjoining tastefully embellished demesne of Leixlip Castle. The Lucan spa is much frequented by visitors and invalids. A beautiful and capacious new hotel and sanitorium has been completed by the "Lucan Hydropathic Spa Co., Limited," and is generally crowded with visitors. There is an electric railway from Dublin, Conyngham-road, to Lucan.

MALAHIDE, a maritime town and parish in Coolock barony, Dublin county, nine miles N. from Dublin, comprising an area of 1,126 acres. Population, 685. The town is situated on a narrow inlet of the sea, and on the Great Northern railway. The Castle is a large square building, flanked by lofty circular towers, and stands on a high limestone rock, commanding a fine view of the town and bay. Of the original Castle little remains but the site, and that has been greatly enlarged and improved; the principal front is embattled, and the main entrance, which is under a splendid Gothie porch, is defended by two circular towers. The grand hall is rocfed with richly-carved ancient Irish oak, lighted by three large windows, with a gallery at the end. Among the many splendid apartments the Castle contains, the most curious is that called the "oak chamber," ceiled and wainscoted with richly-carved oak, in compartments, containing scriptural devices, and lighted with a pointed window of stained glass. In the drawing-room, among other valuable paintings, there is a small altar-piece painted by Albert Durer, said to have been originally in the oratory of Mary Queen of Scots, at Holyrood House. The demesne is adorned with groups of stately trees, and the grounds and gardens of the Castle are beautifully laid out. It is open daily to visitors. The town contains many handsome private residences which are permanently occupied. The only public buildings are the Church, a neat edifice of the later English style, which has recently been enlarged and restored, and a handsome Roman Catholic Church. It has a large and handsome Hotel, a Constabulary Police and a Coast-guard Station, a National School, and a Parochial Church of Ireland School. Off the coast there are profitable beds of oysters, the property of the Lord of the Manor. There is a Postal Telegraph Office at the Post Office.

PALMERSTOWN.

Palmerstown, or Palmerston, a parish and village in Uppercross barony, Dublin county, five miles west from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 1,518 acres. Population of the village, 186. It is situated on the river Liffey and road to Lucan. The village consists of neat cottages built by the County Council, and a Roman Catholic chapel. The Great Southern and Western line of railway passes through the parish. In the vicinity there are several handsome seats and villas, the principal of which is Palmerstown House, a former seat of the Earl of Donoughmore, erected by his ancestor, the Right Hon. T. H. Hutchinson, when Secretary for Ireland. It is now occupied by the Stewart Institution. It is a spacious mansion on an elevated situation, commanding fine views. There is now an electric tramway, which starts from Conyngham-road and runs to Lucan.

PEMBROKE URBAN DISTRICT.

Ballsbridge, a village in St. Mary's, Donnybrook, parish, Dublin barony and county, two miles S.E. from the General Post Office, Dublin. It is situate on the road to Kingstown and Bray, and takes its name from a bridge which here crosses the Dodder, erected in 1791, rebuilt in 1835, and widened and improved by the Urban District Council in 1904. In the approach to it, on the right of the road, where many villas now stand, is the site of Baggot-Rath castle, occupied by the forces of the Marquess of Ormonde in 1649, and stormed and taken by Cromwell in 1651. The Church of Ireland, St. Mary's, is situate at Simmonscourt, Donnybrook. The Church of St. Bartholomew Church of Ireland, erected from the designs of T. H. Wyatt, esq., at a cost of about £6,000, is situate at the junction of Elgin-road and Clyde-road, near Ballsbridge. The parochial district assigned to it includes that part of Pembroke township which lies between Wellington-road and the River Dodder, and between the Dublin and Kingstown Railway and the Donnybrook-road. The botanic garden of the University is in the vicinity. There is a District and Branch Post Office at Shelbourne-road, Ballsbridge, where Money Order, Savings Bank, Telegraph, &c., business is transacted and from which delivery of letters for the district is effected, and the Royal Veterinary College is also here. The Pembroke Urban District includes Baggotrath, Clonskeagh, Donnybrook, Irishtown, Merrion, Kingsend and Sandymount, and contains an area of 1,023 acres, or about 2½ square miles. Population in 1911, 29,294 (estimated 1915, 30,538), and the number of municipal electors, 5,995. The valuation of the Urban District in 1915 was £136,309. The electric tram cars pass to and from Dublin every few minutes.

RANELAGH AND CULLENSWOOD-see RATHMINES AND RATHGAR URBAN DISTRICT.

RANELAGH, a suburban district in the parish of St. Peter, Uppercross barony, Dublin county, two miles S.E. from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 170 acres. It is situated on the road to Dundrum and Enniskerry. Here is a Carmelite Convent, with a neat Chapel, and a Methodist Church, also the Sandford Church of Ireland founded in 1826. There is a station on the Dublin and South-Eastern Poilbrack Parish Convents. Railway here. About half a mile further on is Cullenswood, a village in the same parish and barony as Ranelagh, comprising an area of 113 acres. There is a Town Sub-Post Office at 13, Ranelagh, and another at 13, Dunville-avenue. Electric Trams run to and from Sackville-street every 5 minutes.

RATHCOOLE AND SAGGARD.

RATHCOOLE, an inland town and parish in Newcastle barony, Dublin county, 10 miles S. W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 4,705 acres. Population, 191. The town, which was anciently called Radcull, is situated prising an area of 4,703 acres. Population, 131. The town, which was anciently called Maccuin, is studied upon the road to Naas, and consists of one street, about a quarter of a mile in length, chiefly of small houses and cabins, irregularly built. The only public building is the Church of Ireland Church, a neat plain edifice. It has a Dispensary. It is the head station of the Constabulary force of the district of Uppercross. About two miles and a half N.W. from Rathcoole is the parish and village of Newcastle, comprising an area of 4,283 acres. Population, 1,108. It is situated on the Grand Canal. The village was formerly a borough, having a portrieve and burgesses under charter of James I., and prior to the Union, sent two members to the Irish Parliament. The Church of Ireland Church is an ancient picturesque edifice, covered with ivy, having a fine eastern window. The Roman Catholic Church is a neat building, with a belfry. There is a Dispensary and National Schools. Petty Sessions are held the first Friday in each month. There is a Postal Telegraph Office at the Post Office.

RATHFARNHAM.

RATHFARNHAM, a parish and village in Uppercross and Rathdown baronies, Dublin county, four miles south from the G.P.O., Dublin, comprising an area of 2,581 acres. Population, 9,208. It is situated on the road to Whitechurch, and near where the Military-rd. commences that crosses the mountains into Wicklow county, population of village 423. The village consists of one long irregular st.: the Church of Ireland Church on the right side, with a tower and spire. The Roman Catholic Church is a large building. The Loretto Convent, in the vicinity, is a modern building, attached to which there is an elegant chapel, a female free school, also a ladies' boarding and day modern building, attached to which there is an elegant chapel, a female free school, also a ladies boarding and day school. The Novitiate College of the Augustinians and St. Columba's College are in the neighbourhood. There is also a Dispensary, a Petty Sessions Court-house, and Constabulary Police Station. Three fairs are held in the year—May 15, July 10, October 7. The bridge of Rathfarnham, over the river Dodder, is several hundred yards from the village, the approach to which is rising ground, thickly shaded in summer by the trees of the demesnes on each side. The neighbourhood abounds in pretty seats and villas, commanding rich views of the Dublin mountains and bay. At Grange is situated the "Priory," the residence of the famous John Philpot Curran, The castle of Rathfarnham was built by Archbishop Loftus in the reign of Elizabeth. One of the entrances to the demesne, fronting the Dodder, is in the style of a Roman triumphalarch. The entrance to the castle is by a portico of eight Doriccolumns that support a dome painted in fresco with the signs of the zodiac. Ballyboden, a village in the parish of Whitechurch, is about one and a quarter miles farther ou, and comprises an area of two acres. Population, 154. There is a Postal Telegraph Office at the Post Office.

RATHMINES AND RATHGAR URBAN DISTRICT.

RATHMINES, an extensive district, suburban to the metropolis, in the parish of St. Peter, Uppercross and Rathdown haronies. Dublin county, two miles south from the General Post Office, Dublin. It is situated on Rathdown baronies, Dublin county, two miles south from the General Post Office, Dublin. It is situated on the road to Rathfarnham and Tallaght, and is one continued line of buildings, upwards of a mile and half in the road to Kathfarnham and Tallaght, and is one continued line of buildings, upwards of a mile and half in length, intersected by numerous terraces, with detached villas, and only separated from the city, at Portobello, by the Grand Canal, here crossed by La Touche's bridge, and where the 'municipal and parliamentary boundaries terminate. The Church of the Church of Ireland is dedicated to the Holy Trinity, and was rebuilt at a cost of £6,000. The Roman Catholic Church is a large and handsome structure, in the later style, and the principal one of the Union of St. Mary and St. Peter. There are a Presbyterian Church at the corner of Highfield-road, Rathgar, and a Methodist Church at Charleston-road and at Brighton-road. On the right of the road from Dublin is Portobello Military Barracks. There are also a Town Hall, an imposing structure, free and National Schools, a Municipal Technical Institute (a fine building situated in Leinster-road, erected at a cost of £10,000, giving adequate accommonation for the extensive work of the School of Commerce and the School of Domestic Economy, opened October 1913 a Public Library (established 1837, now housed in the School of Domestic Economy, opened October, 1913), a Public Library (established 1887, now housed in a handsome building erected through the munificence of Andrew Carnegie, esq., LL.D., at a cost of £8,500, opened October, 1913), a Police Station, a Fire Brigade Station, and branches of the National, Royal, Belfast,

Ulster, and Munster and Leinster Banks.
In 1847, a local Act was obtained, creating that part of the parish of St. Peter which is in the barony of Uppercross into a Township; and this Act was amended by the Rathmines and Rathgar Improvement Act, 1862, by which the Townland of Rathgar and the small Townland of Sallymount were included; and was amended again by the St. Catherine's Improvement Act, 1866, by which the townlands of St. Catherine and St. Nicholas Without, in the barony of Uppercross, were included; again by Milltown Extension Act, 1880, by which Milltown was added. The total valuation of the Township is £184,536 8s. The Council have constructed Water-works at a cost of about £200,000 at Glan-na-Smoil Valley, which supplies the Township with water under Rathmines and Rathgar Water Act, 1880. Tram cars ply on the Rathmines road, starting every few minutes from Nelson's Pillar, in Sackville-street, to Rathmines, Rathgar, and Terenure, Upper Rathmines and Darty-road and via Ranelagh to Palmerston-road and Palmerston-park. There is a Postal Telegraph Office at the Branch and District Post Office, Portobello Bridge, also at the Branch Post Office, Wynneneld-road, and Town Sub-Offices at Rathgar, Ranelagh, Upper Rathmines, Harold's Cross, and Milltown. TALLAGHT.

Tallaght, an inland village and parish in Uppercross barony, Dublin county, seven miles S. W. by W. from G.P.O. Dublin, comprising an area of 21,868 acres. Population of parish, 4.921; of town, 232, inhabiting 65 houses. The town is situated on the road to Blessington, and the parish extends from the village of Templeogue to Crumlin, and on its southern side to Balrothery hill on the river Dodder, to the Green hills at its western extremity. The southern portion forms the range called the Tallaght Hill, and commands magnificent views of the bay and vale of Dublin. The church, a little above the town, dedicated to St. Maelrune, is a modern building in the pointed style. At Firhouse there is a convent of Discalced Carmelites, and in the village is the Priory of the Dominican order at St. Mary's, where a beautiful Memorial Church has been erected to the memory of the Very Rev. Thomas Burke. In the town there is a Dispensary, and there are National Schools. It is a Constabulary Police station, and Petty Sessions are held every alternate Monday. New Petty Sessions Court House erected by the County Council at a cost of over £1,000. There is a Postal Telegraph at the Post Office. Mr. Robert Boardman's paper mill at Boldbrook is in the vicinity. The cars of the Dublin and Blessington Steam Tramway Co. running between Terenure and Blessington, pass through Tallaght, which is a station on the line now running to Poulaphuca, a most interesting and charming line of country opened up by the enterprise of the Steam Tramway Company.
