CLONDALKIN

Clondalkin, an inland parish and village, partly in Newcastle, but chiefly in Uppercross barony, Dublin county, $\frac{1}{2}$ miles S.W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 4,777 acres, of which 44 are in the village. Population, 2,179; of village, 271. It is situated near the ninth lock of the Grand Canal, and close to the line of the Great Southern Railway, of which it is the first station from Dublin. It was anciently named Cluain-Dolan, and by the Danes Dun-awley. The village consists chiefly of one irregular street, of small but neatly built cottages. The only public buildings are the Parish Church, a small plain modern building, a neat Roman Catholic Church, and a Public Library, erected through the munificence of Andrew Carnegie in 1910, and a Parochial and two National Schools. The ancient round tower is the nearest structure of the kind to the metropolis, and is in a state of good preservation. It stands 100 feet high, 15 feet in diameter, and is covered with a conical roof of stone.

Coolock, a parish and village in the barony of the same name, Dublin county, four miles N.N.E. from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 1,734 acres, of which five are occupied by the village. It is situated on the road to Malahide. It is studded with handsome residences, most of which command fine views of the bay of Dublin and surrounding country. The Church of Ireland Church in the village, dedicated to St. Brandon, is a neat edifice. The Roman Catholic Church is a very pretty edifice, with a belfry over the entrance.

LUCAN

Lucan, an inland town and parish in Newcastle barony, Dublin county, seven miles W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 1,126 acres. Population about 1,200. The town is prettily situated in a fertile vale, on the banks of the river Liffey, which is here crossed by a fine stone bridge of one arch. Its public buildings are, the Church of Ireland, a neat structure with a tower and spire, a large Roman Catholic Church, a Presentation Convent, a Methodist Church and Manse, and a Presbyterian Church and Manse. It has a Dispensary, a Lending Library, National Schools, and a Parochial Hall; also a Post Office and Telephone Exchange. In the grounds of Weston Lodge and Leixlip Castle is the well-known and much frequented waterfall, called the Salmon Leap, which consists of a succession of rock ledges crossing the Liffey, over which the fish dart at one bound. It forms a beautiful cascade, the picturesque effect of which is greatly increased by the rich and lofty wooded banks of the river and the adjoining tastefully embellished demesne of Leixlip Castle. The Lucan sulphur spa is much frequented by visitors. There are regular daily bus services to Lucan from Aston's Quay, Dublin.

MALAHIDE

Mulla'c ioe.

Malahide, a maritime town and parish in Coolock barony, Dublin county, nine miles N. from Dublin, comprising an area of 1,126 acres. Population about 1,500. The town is situated on a narrow inlet of the sea, and adjacent to the Great Northern Railway. The castle is a large square medieval building, flanked by lofty circular towers, standing on a high limestone rock. Of the original Castle little remains but the site, and that has been greatly enlarged. The principal front is embattled and the main entrance, which is under a splendid Gothic porch, is defended by two circular towers. The grand hall is roofed with richly-carved ancient Irish oak, lighted by three large windows, with a gallery at the end. Among the many splendid apartments the Castle contains the most curious is that called the "oak chamber," ceiled and wainscoted with richly-carved oak. In compartments, containing scriptural devices and lighted with a pointed window of stained glass. In the drawing-room, among other valuable paintings, there is a small altar-piece painted by Albert Durer, said to have been originally in the oratory of Mary Queen of Scots, at Holyrood House. The dmesne is adorned with groups of stately trees, and the grounds and gardens of the Castle are beautifully laid out. It is open on Wednesdays and Fridays to visitors. It has a large and handsome hotel. There is also a Postal and Telegraph Office. There is a regular bus and train service between Dublin and Malahide.

PHENIX PARK.

The Phoenix Park, contiguous to the N.W. boundary of Dublin city, and N. of the river Liffey, comprises an area of 1,760 statute acres, and is about seven miles in circumference. Irish antiquarians derive its name from a spring of limpid water, in Irish *fiann-uisce*, pronounced *fin-uiske*, and gradually corrupted into *phoenix*. The greater portion of it formed part of the possessions of the Knights Hospitallers, and on the suppression of the monasteries was surrendered to Henry VIII., and was afterwards enclosed for a deer park by the Duke of Ormonde, in the reign of Charles II. Several additions were subsequently made to it, and the whole was laid out in an ornamental manner by the Earl of Chesterfield, when Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, who also erected in it a pillar thirty feet high, surmounted by a phoenix rising out of the flames. In allusion to its popular name, and caused it to be thrown open as a place of recreation. There is also a splendid equestrian statue of General Gough. In the Park are also the Wellington Testimonial, a lofty obelisk of granite, 150 feet high; and the Zoological Gardens.

RATHCOOLE AND SAGGART.

Rathcoole, an inland village and parish in Newcastle barony, Dublin county, 10 miles S.W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 4,705 acres. Population about 250. The village, which was anciently called Radcuil, is situated upon the road to Naas, and consists of one street, about a quarter of a mile in length, chiefly of small houses, irregularly built. The only public building is the Church of Ireland Church, a neat plain edifice. It has a Dispensary. About two miles and a half N.W. from Rathcoole is the parish and village of Newcastle, comprising an area of 4,283 acres Population, about 1,200. The village was formerly a borough, having a portrieve and burgesses under charter of James I., and prior to the Union, sent two members to the Irish Parliament. The Church of Ireland Church is an ancient picturesque edifice, having a fine eastern window. The Roman Catholic Church is a neat building with a belfry. There is a Dispensary and National Schools. There is also a Post Office.

RATHFARNHAM.

Rathfarnham, a parish and village in Uppercross and Rathdown baronies, Dublin county, four miles south from the G.P.O., Dublin, comprising an area of 2,581 acres. Population, about 10,000. It is situated on the road to Whitechurch, and near where the Military-road commences that crosses the mountains into Wicklow county. The village was included in the City of Dublin under the Local Government (Dublin) Act, 1930, as from the 1st October, 1930. The Roman Catholic Church is a large building in the main street. The Loreto Convent, in the vicinity, is a modern building, attached to which there is an elegant chapel, a female free school, also a ladies' boarding and day school. The Novitiate College of the Augustinians and St. Columba's College are in the neighbourhood. There is also a Dispensary and a District Justice Courthouse. The bridge of Rathfarnham, over the river Dodder, is several hundred yards from the village, the approach to which is rising ground, thickly shaded in summer by the trees of the demesnes on each side. The neighbourhood abounds in pretty seats and villas, commanding rich views of the Dublin mountains and bay. At Grange is situated the "Priory," the residence of the famous John Philpot Curran. The castle of Rathfarnham was built by Archbishop Loftus in the reign of Elizabeth. One of the entrances to the demesne, fronting the Dodder, is in the style of a Roman triumphal arch. The entrance to the castle is by a portico of eight Doric columns that support a dome painted in fresco with the signs of the zodiac. Ballyboden, a village in the parish of Whitechurch, is about one and a quarter miles farther on, and comprises an area of two acres. There is a Postal and Telegraph Office in Rathfarnham.

Ringsend, a maritime village in the parish of St. Mary's, Donnybrook, Dublin barony and county, 2 miles east from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 54 acres. It is situated upon the eastern bank of the river Dodder, at its confluence with the Liffey and tidal estuary of the harbour. The name is said to have been originally Rin-Aun—i.e., appropriately, "the point of the tide." Until a very late period it and the place known as the Pigeon-house fort, to which a mole called the South Wall extends from the village 17,754 feet into the bay, was the chief landing and embarking place of Dublin. Close to the village, on the western side of the Dodder, are the Grand Canal Docks, comprising an area of 25 acres, with 2,000 yards of quayage, and from 17 to 18 feet depth of water. There are 3 gravings docks.
