Dublin, Leinster and All-Ireland Champions — again!

Tries scored: 45 tries conceded: 1 — not a bad record against teams from established rugby clubs such as Clontarf, Greystones and Ballinasloe.

Who are these young heroes? Firstly Stephen (the mighty) Quinn, Captain and terror of oppositions; Colin Moran, dynamic defence destroyer and opportunist; Colm McWeeney, out-half and director; Michael Moran, captain in semi-final and scorer of the All-Ireland winning try; Patrick Healy — the ironman who could (and did) play in any position; Mark Fee, equally energetic and determined; Patrick Whelan, skilful on and witty off the field; Andrew O'Brien and Gareth Murphy, outstanding forwards; Colin Moynagh, his speed in the final was vital; Derek Wilson, excellent tackler and marvellous score in Leinster final; Barry Saville, excellent winger and fearless tackler. Together an invincible combination.

No Dublin team gave them a game and the Dublin cup was easily won. In Leinster, Greystones were a strong team but Stephen's three tries ended their challenge. The Leinster final against Clara was very one sided — the only exciting moment was the arrival of Colm back from Dingle with a minute to spare.

Mosney would be the real test. Stephen was deliberately not played against Letterkenny in the semi-final which we won easily. Thurles beat Ballinasloe — would they beat us too like last year?

It was a memorable match. Stephen's presence overawed Thurles in the first half and tremendous pressure resulted in a Knocklyon score — a superb try by Michael after six players had handled. The second half was torture as Thurles were camped on our line but the Knocklyon boys would not yield. Finally the whistle sounded and Knocklyon were All-Ireland Champions for the fourth time. The celebrations continue.

Most people in Knocklyon know Jim Gorman. He is a warm, friendly likeable man – a fine big fellow with a cheerful smiling face. There is also something special about him. He is one of those amazing people whom we often read about – someone who has turned a hobby into a thriving business.

It all started because he had gooseberries growing in the garden. Their growth was prolific. Pounds of them were given to friends and his wife Phil made endless gooseberry pies. Despite all this there were masses still left, so Jim decided to try his hand at making jam. It was a great success and after this there was no keeping him out of the kitchen. Not, I may add, to take over the general cooking. No – Jim Gorman was hooked on making jam.

Fate took a hand the day he gave Peter Hughes (then Manager of Superquinn) a pot of jam as a thank you for a little favour he had received. Peter Hughes was impressed. "Absolutely delicious" was his verdict. "Do you think you could supply us with 40 jars to see how it goes?"

Jim walked home in a daze – 40 jars – it was a colossal amount. How could he cope? Where would he get them. Phil was a tower of strength. "Without her" he says "we'd never have made it."

The rest is history. Orders came flowing in. They converted their garage into a special kitchen for the project. Strawberry jam, Black-

currant jam, Raspberry and Apple jam, Marmalade – were all added to the range. Knocklyon Home Produce was born.

No one was more surprised with this success than Jim himself. A true born Dub – born in the Liberties, educated in Marlborough Street, Bolton Street and the Tech, he entered the motor trade as a mechanic and progressed to the post of Service Manager in Gowan's of Parkgate Street, finally joining the staff of AnCO. In his early years he was the lead singer in a showband where he also played the tenor-sax. During this time he met and married his wife Phil.

Recently Phil and Jim moved to new premises in the IDA Enterprise Centre in Tallaght. It is a magnificent building where various businesses and crafts are carried on under the watchful eyes of the IDA and the Eastern Health Board Inspectors. Hygiene standards are strict and must comply with EEC regulations.

Knocklyon Home Produce unit is large, airy and bright. From the window there is a view of the Dublin mountains. It gleams with cleanliness and stainless steel. They have come a long way from that first order of 40 jars. Now they use two and a half thousand a fortnight, supplied by the Irish Glass Bottle Company.

Phil runs the Tallaght unit, but herself and Jim are a great team. They are forever testing and trying out new ideas and have built up a library of special recipes and have planned a whole new line in the near future. Jim has no ambitions to go really big, "I would be happy to maybe employ a few people and export more – I'd like to spread goodwill for Ireland. I would never want to lose the personal touch."

Even though the premises at Tallaght are larger and have more facilities Jim Gorman's jams are exactly the same as that first pot of gooseberry. They are no different from the original and the little blurb that describes the making of it tells all – *"These preserves are manufactured by a family living at the foot of the Dublin mountains. Only fresh fruit, sugar, liquers are used – no artificial colourings or preservatives are used."*

New Classrooms — SOME FACTS

We would like to make a few brief observations re classrooms etc. in Knocklyon schools. I speak as Chairperson, Board of Management, Senior School and as one involved in long and hard negotiations, mostly with the Department of Education ever since September, 1988.

I suggest concerned parents come to us for information. Newspaper stories do not always necessarily reflect the true facts of the situation. I assure you we worked hard and consistently. Why the delay then? — substantially, bureaucracy, red-tape. It was no joy to us not to have the buildings ready for September and we very much regret the inconvenience caused to parents, pupils and teachers.

The work is now well in progress and we are doing our best to have it ready early November. Tony O'Driscoll, the builder is confident this target will be achieved.

Finally we understand that one local politician has been interpreted as somehow being against the provision of the new classrooms. As far as we are concerned this allegation is not in any way accurate. All local politicians, without exception, worked for us and positively helped us in our efforts to obtain the new accommodation.

DEPOSITS TAKEN

"Yes, I remember it (well maybe not so) well!"

This is a year of looking back to 50 years ago — for those of us who can go back that far! I have no memories of the day war was declared, but do remember the following day in the local school yard on the way to class, probably opening day after the Summer Hols., that year. We were conscious of something really big happening out there. There was a sense of great excitement, real fear too of the unknown — what if it came closer?

Let us jog the memory a bit, for personal experiences — the sequence of memories will be jumbled. In the early stages there would be the black-out! Windows in the few public buildings in our area were blackened, and in our homes we were expected to improvise, so that no tell-tale light would escape into the night's darkness. Was it presumptuous of us to think for a moment that our modest sized seaside town, might even remotely figure in Hitler & Co.'s plans? But then, British trawlers sheltered in our harbour in stormy weather and Lord Haw Haw of "Germany Calling" notoriety, was alleged to have threatened dire consequences on Irish harbours who sheltered such boats. The same Haw Haw was semi-joke, semi-sinister, but mostly sinister, because he was bringing the actual war closer.

Being in a wartime situation the first big sinkings of the war, had for us local repercussions, such as the sinking of the British battleship "Royal Oak" at Scapa Flow, and the destruction of the other British ship "Hood" by the German warship, "Bismarck". Some fellow townsmen of mine would have perished, in such romantic, albeit grim, episodes. I remember sea mines drifting uncomfortably close to our area, and even a few primitive air raid shelters.

Developments then evolved fast and furious — the L.D.F., the L.S.F. (affectionately Dad's Army) and for the ladies mostly, the Red Cross.

We will have our various memories of food and clothing rationing, and the political figures of the time: "Bless De Valera and Sean McEntee who gave us the brown bread and half ounce of tea".

In the early stages there was the poorly dried turf, but then any port in a storm! Remember the wireless, long, long before R.T.E.? — Tommy Hanley and Itma (it's that man again), Music while you work, Very Lynn "Bluebells over the white cliffs of Dover", "Lilli Marlene", "A Nightingale Sang in Barkley Square", "Run, Rabbit, Run".

Exciting romantic times they were, but the grim reality always weighing in the background — death, destruction, slaughter of the innocent, but also life and beauty. Even out of the awesome Death Camps, came at least two saints — Maximilian Kolbe and our own Carmelite Titus Bransma. Some of our older priests remember Br. Titus visiting Ireland before the war — brilliant mind, but quiet, unassuming and partial to the smoking!

Was the Lord in the war? I suspect very much so. What was he telling us? — of our absolute need for him, not just for '39, '45, but for ever since, today, and always.






