There is a better way of reducing the deficit and putting our finances back on track without cutting out the heart of the economy and destroying our education, health and social services.

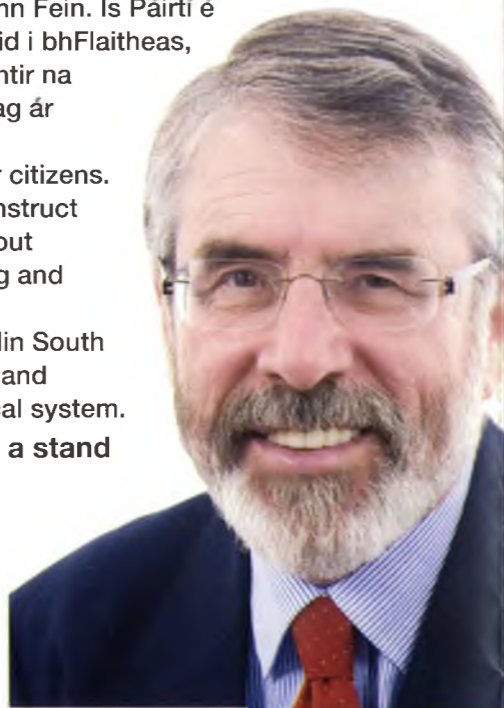

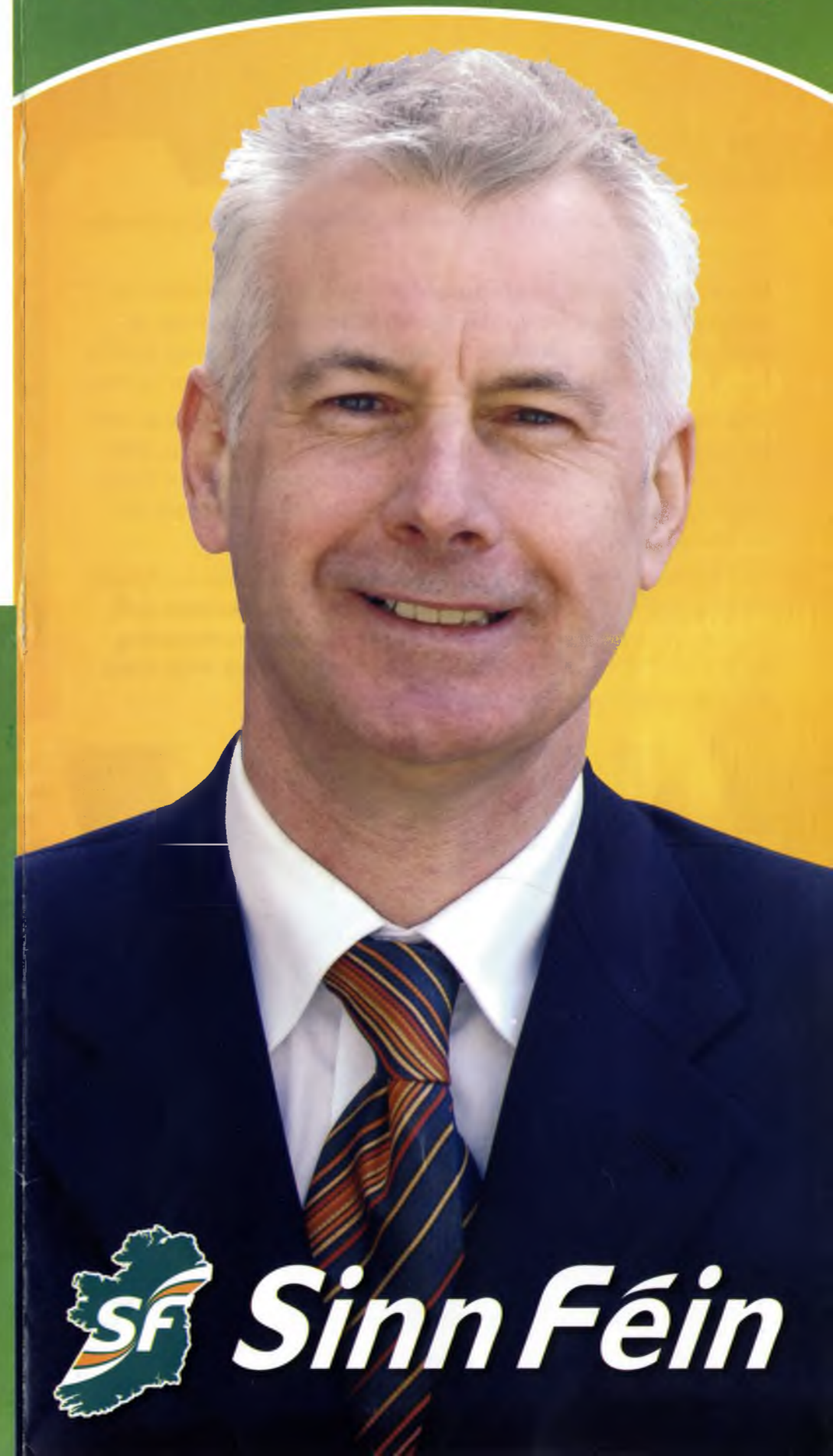

PROFILE SEÁN CROWE

A lifelong community activist from Tallaght, Seán is married to Pamela and lives in Raheen.

Seán's political beliefs centre around empowering communities. He believes that people from all backgrounds must work together to improve services and facilities for local residents and in doing so, help create a safe new environment for our families and ourselves to enjoy.

First elected as a councillor on South Dublin County Council in 1999, Sean also served as a TD for Dublin South West from 2002 to 2007. Sean was a member of the Sinn Féin team that negotiated the Good Friday Agreement and has travelled internationally to promote the party's peace strategy.

Seán has been to the fore in fighting for proper resources for Tallaght Hospital, promoting local employment, lobbying for affordable and social housing programmes, combating social exclusion, demanding equal access to education for all, tackling the continuing drugs crisis, and addressing youth alienation.



SEÁN'S PRIORITIES

Sinn Féin has set out a better and fairer way to restore our economy. Only Sinn Féin refused to sign up to the government's consensus for cuts and instead put forward a real costed alternative for economic recovery.

We are the only party to clearly state that we would reverse cuts to public services and social welfare introduced in Budget 2011.

Sinn Féin are committed to making the bank bond holders pay for their reckless gambling. We believe the taxpayer shouldn't have to pay for the banks mismanagement.

SEAN'S COMMITMENTS:

(1) Getting Ireland back to work, retaining and creating jobs must be the priority of government. Traditional sectors such as manufacturing and engineering were allowed collapse in Dublin South West. Sinn Féin will:

- » Transfer money from the National Pensions Reserve Fund to create thousands of jobs, building essential schools and health facilities.
- » Create a €500 million youth jobs fund and allow young workers to finish apprenticeships.

(2) Halt the run down of Tallaght Hospital and restore its full range of services.

We oppose the single site National Paediatric Hospital plan. Tallaght must retain a full paediatric health service.

(3) Dublin South West needs quality affordable housing for all. Dublin South West needs quality affordable housing for all. Sinn Féin would introduce measures to deal with negative equity suffered by those on average incomes who bought houses at inflated prices during the property bubble. We would also allow home-buyers to renegotiate mortgages from fixed to variable rates and to make "lump sum only" repayments.

SINN FÉIN STANDS UP FOR ORDINARY PEOPLE

People are looking for a new kind of politics. For Sinn Féin actions speak louder than words.

Sinn Féin was the only party to oppose the Lisbon Treaty. Now the EU wants to change our tax laws as the price of the bailout Sinn Féin forced the government to hold the Donegal SW by election.

Sinn Féin exposed the Taoiseach's contacts with Anglo Irish Bank directors.

Sinn Féin is the only party not to sign up to the Fianna Fáil/Green Party/Fine Gael/Labour consensus for cuts and instead put forward a real alternative for economic recovery.

Sinn Féin TDs only take home the average industrial wage.
