



ELEVENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR:

Lord, hear my voice when I call to you. You are my help; do not cast me off, do not desert me, my Saviour God.

Let us pray (for the grace to follow Christ more closely). Almighty God, our hope and our strength, without you we falter. Help us to follow Christ and to live according to your will. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son.

FIRST READING: A Reading from the Book of Exodus.

The Israelites set out from Rephidim and came into the wilderness of Sinai, they encamped in the wilderness; and there Israel encamped before the mountain. And Moses went up to God, and the Lord called to him out of the mountain, saying 'Thus you shall say to the house of Jacob, and tell the people of Israel: You have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself. Now therefore if you will obey my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my own possession among all peoples; for all the earth is mine, and you shall be to me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.'
THIS IS THE WORD OF THE LORD.

SECOND READING: A Reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans. While we were yet helpless, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. Why, one will hardly die for a righteous man - though perhaps for a good man

one will dare even to die. But God shows his love for us in that while we were yet sinners Christ died for us. Since, therefore, we are now justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. For, if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life. Not only so, but we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received our reconciliation. THIS IS THE WORD OF THE LORD.

GOSPEL: A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew. When Jesus saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless like sheet without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples 'The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to sent out labourers into his harvest'. And he called to him his twelve disciples and gave them

authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal every disease and every infirmity. The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; James, the son of Zebedee, and John his brother; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James, the son of Alphaeus. and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.

These twelve Jesus sent out, charging them, 'Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. And preach as you go, saying 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand." Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, cast out demons. You received without pay, give without pay.

YOUR CREDIT UNION - a short series - No.I.

In a Credit Union the members are the owners. Only the members can use its services and receive benefits from its operation. It is a co-operation that has democracy - "The rule of the people" as its most important principle of operation. Membership is defined by a common 'bond'. Your credit union has as its common bond residency in Lucan and district. Every person within the district is entitled to membership on application but of course unless in good standing may not avail of the full benefits. The operation of the credit union movement in Ireland is governed by "The Credit Union Act" of 1966. Each credit union is an independent unit, but most are affiliated to the Irish League of Credit unions for legal and insurance purposes. The members at A.G.M. elect a board of directors and charge the board with the responsibility of running the affairs of the credit union for the following year. 
