Dedication or Constraint

For most of us there are many motives for our actions no matter whether they are good or bad. That's just the way it is. I remember talking to a community care nurse some time ago who said that often he had to think about why some of the people remained in need of care. Some of them he said used to "enjoy poor health"! They liked the attention because they were sick. Thus, if they got better too soon, then the care would dry up. He used to ask himself: what's in it for my Patient if she/he gets better.

Equally we often hear of enabling' Drink or Drug or, any Addicts. The enabler is the person or persons who takes away negative consequences of the addict's action. For example: Mam or Dad comes in at night drunk, getting sick on the front door step and breaking one of the kitchen chairs as he/she flops into it, the whole house is awake. Next morning, some other adult cleans up the step and puts the broken chair under the stairs before anyone else gets up. No one says anything the next morning and the drunk conveniently forgets the whole episode. Now it takes a wise person to be able to function in such a house while also leaving the evidence around so that the Drunk gets the message that everyone's life is being ruined by the drinking.

It's the same with the gambler, you don't pay off their debts or they will stay gambling. You bring them to the appropriate helping agency.

In commitment in Marriage we speak of **Dedication** and **Constraint**. **Dedication** comes from within. Someone who trains for sports, maybe going out in all weathers to train is motivated from with in. **Constraint** comes from outside the person. Granny is getting too old to live by herself. One of the family is available to move in and mind her. This person would prefer that this situation didn't exist but it does, and everyone else, in fairness will play their part. The minder does the job with the support and maybe pressure from others. Granny gets minded!

A friend of mine often says that at a low ebb in her marriage she thought of leaving her husband but she had no where to go, so they just had to work at it, and they are now back to being a happy couple. Her commitment was by constraint and her marriage was saved. Believe it or not but most of our commitments in life have a mixture of Dedication and Constraint in them, more mixed motives!

So while no one could agree with the language used by Kevin Myers in his recent column, maybe he was saying that

- The Social Welfarc system is enabling people to prefer to live in Single Parent Families,
- Maybe it is enabling men not to support the children they have fathered.
- Maybe the Social Welfare System hides the broken chair of relationships under the stairs.
- Maybe a little Constraint from the State on the absent parent might be no harm, and might help Men in particular to commit to supporting their children.
- Maybe a little more enforcement of the Social Welfare rules might discourage the urban myth that life is all Rosey with single parent families.

Transport Users

It's now dawning on many people how bad the traffic situation will be as the Adamstown development has started. This is just the beginning as there are many other housing developments in surrounding counties. This, along with upgrading of all roads into Dublin to Motorway standard will leave us with permanent congestion, with many people traffic-locked in their homes.

The present proposals to upgrade the M50 will do little or nothing to ease the traffic situation. In fact it will add to the problems. We have come up with a simple plan that can rectify the traffic situation called a U-bridge plan. It will be displayed and explained at a public meeting on

Tuesday, March 1st, in Foxhunter at 8 pm. This is our chance to influence the traffic planners before the final decision is made. A big turn out is essential. They are also intent on going ahead with the bus lane on Newcastle Road while ignoring other areas on the bus corridor where problems are causing long delays.



The big launch of the Adamstown project was on during the week, and in next to no time the 10,000 or so houses (with their projected residents numbering 20,000 – obviously no children allowed!) will be occupied. I

can't believe that sufficient infrastructure will be put in place before this happens. I remember in the 1980's when huge – at the time - local authority housing estates were built in Tallaght and Blanchardstown, without schools, shops, busses etc. The hardship those people endured while trying to settle in a rural environment that was unfamiliar to them in every way, had to be seen to be believed. With Adamstown, of course, it won't be only the new residents that will suffer. We will all be 'land-locked' until the appropriate services are put in place.

For how long will our famous single-span bridge, built in the horse-and-cart era, be able to withstand the pressure? It has become one of the most used routes for crossing the Liffey. Surely the need for an outer-outer ring road is obvious to

more than me? Traffic heading north or south must be diverted before converging on the trafficjam that has become the N4 between Lucan and the M50.



And talking about our Liffey bridge brings me to the Laraghcon Lights saga, when time stood still for hundreds of motorists. How anyone could imagine that the new traffic lights could possibly work without the opening of the relief road is hard to imagine – whether they will even work then is another imponderable.

Having voted against Adamstown and Appealed the Project to An Bord Pleanala on the basis of sufficient infrastructure not being provided for a successful integration of Adamstown into Lucan, I continue to work for more transport infrastructure, amenities etc. Broadband: Thanks to the many who have contacted me on this matter, I am in regular contact with a number of service providers in the interest of Broadband for Lucan.

Lucan Bridge Gridlock: The switching on of the traffic lights in Lucan village before the new road past
Laraghcon caused considerable gridlock this week. Cllr.

Colleagues. We have also liaised with South Dublin County Council. The road must be opened first. One estate's needs cannot hold the entire community to ransom. If Green Party proposals were supported, this problem would not have arisen.

Adamstown: The Green Party did not attend the Adamstown launch this week. While we welcome the fact that there has been some progress on the original plan by the developers and the Council, we will not join the hob-knobbing and backslapping with Bertie until the Government gives cast-iron commitments on the provision of facilities and amenities. These include schools, and electrified, four-track rail line and early opening of community buildings.






