

Anne Loughman . . . the 'new' chaplain at St. Colmcille's Community School

One is immediately struck by the extraordinary enthusiasm and zest Anne Loughman has for her position, and by her huge interest and caring for the young adults in her pastoral care.

Anne, though originally from Cavan, now lives in Templeogue with her husband, Mike – a primary school teacher, and their four children – Sarah (25), Michael (24), Ruth (20) and Hugh (14).

Anne studied English and History at UCD and during her final year her faith became very much alive. She commenced her teaching career in Coláiste Dhulaigh in Coolock — teaching English and Religion. During that time she com-

pleted a two-year diploma in Catechetics at night. Having met and married Mike in 1977 Anne left Coláiste Dhulaigh in 1979 to rear her family.

However, Anne continued to be active in pastoral work, on a voluntary basis, in her own parish, and other parishes and prayer groups. Mike and Anne completed a Prayer Guides' Course in Manresa, with the Jesuits, to help their own faith mature, and to enable them to be with other people on their faith journey.

In the late 80's Anne was invited to contribute a monthly reflection for a magazine 'New Creation', on where God was in the bits and pieces of her life. This she found very worthwhile – as on a monthly basis one had to sit down and reflect on one's own life; and family. The children used to joke when Anne was writing her article, "Well, Mam, who are you writing about this month?" . . . as it would often be based on a situation they had experienced, directly or indirectly.

In 1991 Anne was invited to Fanore, Co. Clare, to a camp for families — 'Camp with the Lord'. This was a family camping holiday with time for Eucharist — a mixture of prayer, faith and fun. This became a really important week in the lives of the children. They met families from all over Ireland, including Northern Ireland — young adults and teenagers whose faith was important. The family still go to Fanore — a beautiful spot between the Burren and the sea — on a yearly basis. There is a great sense of community which has grown over the years — a lot of the original families attend, along with new families, and it's a great place for people to tell their story, and the scene of much healing.

In 1996-1997 Anne felt drawn to a course being run at All Hallows on Pastoral Leadership. Anne felt this was a really blessed but tough year. Anne's Dad had died and

her Mum had come to live with herself, Mike and the family, so this was a busy time for them all. Mike and the family supported Anne magnificently during this period, and the children even typed her projects and essays, which was a great source of amusement for the people on the course! Out of this came the desire to do Chaplaincy work, but there were very few openings in this field. Anne was approached by a couple who offered to sponsor her to work in a new developing parish -Lucan South - for three years, as part of the Parish Team. Anne enjoyed this job immensely, her work included

parish visitation, Young Mothers Support Groups and Youth Weekends, etc. This work led to a course on Spiritual Direction in Manresa. This was a two-year course over weekends.

About the same time Anne and Mike were invited to participate in a Marriage Programme called 'Retrouvaille' — French for Rediscover, a programme designed to provide couples with the tools necessary to work on the different areas of their relationship. "The best investment ever in our relationship," Anne says. They are now presenters on a voluntary basis of this weekend programme.

In 2003 Anne responded to a Diocesan advertisement for Chaplains. Following a successful interview, Anne worked in the Community School in Confey, Co. Kildare, replacing a Chaplain on maternity leave. Anne was re-interviewed by the Diocese last summer and was appointed to the position of Chaplain to St. Colmcille's Community School. She feels blessed in obtaining such a position working with the young people. It has been a good partnership so far, working with the Priests in the Parish, getting to know some of the people in the Parish who have worked with Anne on the first year retreats.

Anne's hope would be that young people would know deeply that they are loved unconditionally by the God who created them. Jn 10:10: "I came that you might have life, life in all its fullness" — Jesus' desire for each of us, especially for young people.

We are privileged to have such an enthusiastic and warm-hearted person looking after the spiritual needs of the young people of Knocklyon in the Community School.

Planning to get married

Planning a wedding can be a busy and stressful time. You might find some of the following information helpful.

REQUIREMENTS

Civil Law

Anyone intending to marry in the Republic of Ireland must give three months notice to the Registrar for the district in which the marriage is to take place. The relevant Registrar's Office will supply you with the necessary forms. On receiving notification, the Registrar will issue a receipt which is essential when registering your marriage.

Church Law

Church law also requires three months notice of your intention to marry. You should contact your own Parish and inform them of your intention. Make an appointment with one of priests of the Parish to complete a Pre-Nuptial Enquiry Form which must be completed within 6 months of your pending marriage. For this purpose, you will require

- i) a recent copy of your Baptismal Certificate
- ii) your Confirmation Certificate and
- iii) letters of freedom which may be obtained from any parish you may have lived in for six months or more since you reached the aged of sixteen.

Pre-Marriage Preparation

Within the Dublin Diocese, you are required to

complete some form of Marriage Preparation. One of the many different courses available is:

ACCORD (Catholic Marriage Advisory Centre) organise Pre-marriage Courses at a number of locations in Dublin. They can be contacted at 39 Harcourt street, Dublin 2. Tel: 478 0883 www.getting married.ie

PREPARING THE WEDDING CEREMONY

Liturgy and Music

The Priest will advise you on your choice of prayers, readings, rite of consent, etc as well as your range of options for selecting appropriate Church music. Couples wishing to have their own Wedding Booklets should show a draft to the priest before having them printed.

Other Considerations

Singer/Organist: If you wish to employ your own organist, singer or musicians, you should contact the Church you have chosen.

Rehearsals: If you are having a rehearsal, please arrange this with both the the priest officiating at the marriage and the Church itself.

Flower Arrangements: It is best that you contact the Church about flowers before making any commitments as they may have particular requirements.

A Remarkable Woman

I have a suggestion that borders on being a request! Read again and reflect on the Easter story of the woman known to us as Mary Magdalene. It is a name that is always associated with the Resurrection story. (John 20, Mt. 28, Lk. 24). What a pity we don't have it in the readings for Easter Sunday instead of reading it on the weekdays that follow.

Mary was one of the women who accompanied Jesus as he travelled on his journey of teaching and healing. St. Matthew's Gospel presents her at the crucifixion and she is there when Christ's body is being prepared for burial.

The church is always in need of a 'blood transfusion from the lives of the saints'. They inject new life into our attitudes and thinking as they share our brokenness and sinfulness.

Mary Magdalene was healed by Jesus and she was the first woman follower to be named in St. Luke's Gospel. According to St. John, Mary visits the tomb on Easter Sunday morning. We can only imagine her distraught condition when she discovered that it was empty. She runs to tell the news to Peter and the other disciples. "They have taken the Lord from the tomb and we don't know where they have put him." Who are the "they" she is referring to? I suppose it takes some of the pain away if we can blame someone else for what happened. When they go back home Mary stays at the tomb weeping. It was difficult

to go beyond the grief she had for Jesus, the person she had known, to the risen Christ. She looks into the tomb and sees the two angels and then receives the ultimate reward for her loyalty when Jesus appears to her. She fails to recognise him until he calls her by name. Afterwards he says, "Go to my brothers". She is the first witness of the Resurrection. Then Jesus says to her, "Stop holding on to me for I am not yet ascended to the Father".

An experience we share

The loss of a loved one is the common thread that binds us all together. But as Mary discovered, "the Lord is close to the broken hearted".

The Ascension, which we have celebrated, explains the transition between the earthly and the enduring presence of Christ. The ascension, as expressed in St. John's gospel, clarifies the concept of 'not clinging', of letting go of Jesus as we once had him, in order to be able to receive his new resurrected presence given in the Holy Spirit. It throws light on the whole concept of human love and intimacy, revealing the paradox between presence and absence, between having to let go of the one kind of presence in order to receive another. For those of us who have lost a loved one that always involves pain but on deeper reflection it also gives hope. A new life begins for those we lose in seeming death.




PARISH FORUM NEWS






TELEVISION COVERAGE


