

IT'S NEVER TOO LATE TO LEARN

In recent years more and more Adult Education Courses are becoming available, and below Mary Clifford shares with us her experience of attending such a course since last September:

I had heard through a friend about the Return To Learning Course for Adults which was set up in 2000 by the VEC and includes computer training. As my knowledge of computers was poor I decided to enrol for this course in the Town Hall, Rathmines. Very soon I realised the other subjects included French, Communications, English Literature and Business Information, and I quickly settled into a four hour day four days a week, and began to enjoy all subjects. I had tried my hand at painting before, but in the Art class on this course I was shown how to draw, and this has opened up a whole new interest for me.

The computer classes were held daily, and I am amazed at the amount of knowledge I have acquired since September. All of the teachers were encouraging and enthusiastic without putting pressure on us! I was fortunate too, that I got a lift to Rathmines each day – thanks Noeleen!

There has also been a great social buzz with this course. The students range in age from 40-80, (and we blend in very well with the hundreds of teenage students in the College). We have a coffee break daily in the College canteen and we marked the end of the year by having an outing – our school tour – to Glendalough, organised by our super tutor, Kitty Murphy.

I would recommend this Course to anyone who has mornings free and would like to spend time learning in relaxed, friendly and easy going surroundings. An Open Day was held in mid-May and many people showed interest in 'signing up' for September. However, I understand there are a few places vacant, but if interested I suggest you act fast. Various Gospel choirs are welcomed to Knocklyon to share their wealth of musical abilities and learn pieces of music from one another. This is done in an atmosphere of friendship and communitas. The result of these "Gospel Nights" is that many of the choirs often perform together at various important liturgical celebrations in their parishes. This powerful and uplifting spirit of Gospel music contributes to a communal sense of celebration and jubilation. There is something mystical about music which can often carry us away from the here and now, from the hustle and bustle of everyday life. The hope of the ICHTHYS Gospel choir is to bring all people together of different creeds, colour, young and old, believers and



non-believers. There has been a constant positive response towards the work that the ICHTHYS choir has undertaken to date. They have enthralled audiences with their lively stage performances and their passion fuelled love for Gospel music.

The next chapter of The ICHTHYS Gospel choir has yet to be written but it's guaranteed to be a page turner. You might think Gospel Music isn't your kind of thing, all that religion and stuff....but you would be surprised when you see hundreds of young and old individuals singing and dancing in the isles. We have come to the end of the 2005/2006 season and it is time once again to reflect on the achievements and the progress of the club during the past year. As always it has been a busy time for the club and all those involved, both at committee level and managing and coaching the various teams.

League/Cup Success

In the 2005/2006 season Knocklyon United teams have won 7 league titles, 4 runner-up and our u16 had a cup win. Again, the senior team performed extremely well and only missed out on promotion by 1 point in the competitive Leinster Senior League

The trip away at Easter proved to be very exciting and enjoyable affair. We had eight teams competing in foreign tournaments in Germany, Holland, Belgium and Spain. John McNamee's U16 premier team had great success in Holland by beating an English team 2-1 in a very high standard final. All our other teams finished 2nd and 3rd which will inspire more trips away next year. Well done to the ladies committee who organised the trip.

To compensate those children who did not travel the club organised a 3 day coaching event with Manchester United Soccer Coaching School. The event took place at Delaford at Easter and proved to be a huge success. It too may become an annual event. For one lucky player it became a dream come true. As the winner of the soccer skills competition over 3 days he was awarded a week long residency place at the Manchester United Soccer Academy. Thanks to Noel Gaughran, Jimmy Peckham, Hugh O Neill and Sean Moran who helped over the 3 days.

Coaching

A new football committee was set up to alleviate the executive committee of some of the day-to-day running of the club. Coaching has been the prime focus of this committee this year. A major success for the committee has been the affiliation of Knocklyon Football Club to Manchester United Soccer Academy. Already we have had 2 coaching sessions at the Academy with more to come.

We are also putting in place our own Coaching Academy for Managers. Under the guidance of John Devine and Liam Buckley there will be over 30 coaching sessions, with top class coaches throughout next season.

Pitches

We have run a number of school-boy semi-finals on behalf of the FAI and have received huge praise for the condition of the pitches and the facilities provided. We have one the best school-boy pitches in the Dublin region and a lot of credit is due to Mary Young who looks after the pitches and facilities. For next year, we will organise the same criteria for Knocklyon Park. This can only benefit the potential skill of our players.

U9 Boys Football Tournament

All the u9 teams have finished a great season and will go on to represent Knocklyon United in our annual tournament to be held and organised by the club. The tournament has been organised by the u9 managers and will take place on the 10th/11th June. Many of the top clubs will participate. The memorial cup, named after Brian Doyle will be presented to the winning team.

Football Presentations

The presentations take place at Delaford Park on Sunday 25th June at 2.30pm. All trophies will be awarded together with the player of the year awards. Managers are reminded to inform all parents and players. All are welcome. Refreshments will be served on the day.

Executive Committee

Sadly this year Sean Moran our Chairman has resigned. Although staying on as Manager Sean will be a huge loss to the club. His commitment and input into our club over the last 10 years is immeasurable. Thankfully he is going to oversee the development project at Knocklyon Park. Well done to Noel Gaughran who will be taking over as Chairman. Noel is one of the longest serving members of Knocklyon Utd having served with the club for up to 25 years. Best of luck. 



Woodstown Village Traffic Update

Present situation

The outrageous traffic queues of last September/October have been severely shortened over the last few months due to the ongoing work of the WVRA. This culminated recently with a deputation meeting to South Dublin County Council by the Knocklyon Community Council at which the WVRA had the opportunity to present the facts of the unacceptable increase in traffic congestion faced by residents since September '05. We would like to take this opportunity to thank the KCC for arranging this meeting. Presently the Gardai have committed a traffic Garda to the Scholarstown Interchange at the morning commuting period although this Garda also covers any accident on the M50.

At the deputation meeting the WVRA outlined the worsening situation since the full opening of the M50 last summer. The increase in traffic queues has led to "Ramp hopping" on and off the northbound carriageway of the M50, which has seriously affected the exiting of vehicles approaching the interchange from the west. The queues back up St Colmcilles Way, Ballycullen Road into our estate and other surrounding estates.

The full upgrade of the Scholarstown interchange is not due to start for a few more years and by that time the continued development of lands behind Woodstown Village will lead to another 2000 vehicles joining the already gridlocked interchange. The opening of the East-West distributor road from Oldcourt to Stocking Lane will quickly fill with the extra cars and increase traffic on the East side of the interchange.

The full upgrade is the only solution. We intend pushing SDCC and the NRA to move up the start time as the Scholarstown Interchange is completely incapable of handling the present volume let alone that of 2/3 years time.

SDCC have agreed to look at placing traffic lights on the interchange in the short term to allow for a fair entry for all approaches. The Gaidai will continue to aid traffic flow until then.

KNOCKLYON HISTORY SOCIETY

Tomás Mac Donagh 1878 - 1916



Thomas Mac Donagh was born in Cloughjordan, Co Tipperary, in 1878, the first of four sons in the family. Two girls had already been born. His parents were teachers in the local Catholic school

As a boy he had many interests, among them reading, games and music. He attended Rockwell College and spent some time as a member of the Holy Ghost Order. In 1896 he

matriculated for the Royal University and went to teach in Kilkenny. While there he joined The Gaelic League and established The Union of Secondary Teachers, which eventually became the ASTI. It was there, too, that he wrote his first book of poetry, Through The Ivory Gate. He then spent some years teaching in St Colman's, Fermoy, before transferring to Pearse's school, St Enda's, in Dublin in 1908. This school had just opened in Ranelagh and in 1910 transferred to Rathfarnham. Mac Donagh lived close to the school in Grange Lodge.

In the same year he obtained his B.A. in Irish, English and French and the following year was awarded an M.A. He was appointed a lecturer in English in University College and became part of the Dublin literary scene. He was editor of the literary magazine, Irish Review and founded The Irish Theatre as an alternative to the Abbey Theatre. He was also interested in the Suffragette Movement.

He married Muriel Gifford in 1911 in The Church of the Holy Name, Beechwood Avenue and they set up home on Oakley Road, Ranelagh. They had two children, a son, Donagh and a daughter, Barbara. He published his last book of poems in 1913.

He joined the Irish Volunteers at their founding in 1913 and was involved in organising the landing of guns in the Asgard in 1914 and the funeral of O'Donovan Rossa the following year. This same year, 1915, he joined the I.R.B. and became a member of its secret Military Council in the spring of 1916 and thus played his part in the organising of the Easter Rising. He was in command

of the garrison in Jacob's in Easter Week and surrendered to General Lowe on Sunday, the 30th of April.

A prisoner in Kilmainham Jail, he was refused permission to see his wife, Muriel, as he already had a visitor (his sister, Mary, an Irish Sister of Charity) before his execution at dawn on 3rd of May.

He is not forgotten in his native Cloughjordan, where the GAA grounds are called after him and a small library opened in his honour.

To mark the 90th anniversary of his death a new Sports Complex is to be called after him.
