Community Games 2006

Athletics: Knocklyon were again very successful at the Dublin Community Games in Santry. Overall we had 7 Gold medal winners.-Five individuals and two relay teams to represent Dublin in the National Finals in Mosney.

Fourth place certificates were awarded to Keith Robinson Boys U/12 Long Puck, Dylan Cannon Boys U/14 800m and to the Boys U/12 relay team-Keith Robinson, Eoghan Morgan, Philip McCormack and Ben McEntee. Darragh McConville Boys U/10 100m and Brian Kirwan,Boys U/10 200m.

At the National Finals in Mosney at the end of August our competitors represented Dublin admirably. Knocklyon competitors won Gold, Silver and Bronze medals. Rachel Dunne ran well in U/8 80m as did the Boys U/14 relay team of Karl Byrne, Simon Whelan, Mark Boyle, Joseph Dowling and Jack Dooney, but were unlucky not to advance. Both Rory Knight U/10m and Oisin Pennycook U/10 H reached the semi finals of their events. Shauna Cannon won Bronze in the U/16 100m and Joseph Dowling won Silver in the U/14 100m. In their last year of Community Games, the Girls U/16 relay team of Lisa Barnwell, Rebecca Tyson, Natalia Hyland, Shauna Cannon and Eilish Knight won Gold beating Roscommon and Limerick in a thrilling final. This was a fitting finale as they had previously won Silver and Bronze in previous years.

Swimming: Knocklyon South won the Best Area for the second year in a row at the Dublin Finals held in Balrothery in June. Gold medal winners were Roisin Hyland, Ciara Robinson, Fionnuala Ni Theimheain, Alison 0 Driscoll, Brendan Hyland, Cormac O'Toole, Aidan Ward, Eoin Small and Eoin O'Donnell. Bronze medals were awarded to Ashling Field, Suzanne Grey, Julie Rowan, and Jack Higgins. Fourth place certificates went to Clodagh Flood and Killian Keane.

At the National Finals, held in the National Aquatic Centre in August, Brendan Hyland won Gold in the U/12 Boys Freestyle. Eoin O'Donnell won Bronze in U/16 Boys Butterfly and Cathal Dunne was awarded Fourth place cert in the U/12 Backstroke. Well done to all our competitors who represented Knocklyon in these competitions.

Soccer: The Knocklyon South Boys U/12 team represented Dublin in the Leinster finals. They had good wins against Wicklow and Kildare, before losing in the semi finals in Carlow. Andrew Doyle and Peter Fullerton managed the team. Thanks to Knocklyon Utd for their support.



Fr. Martin Farragher, O.Carm., Prior.






Knocklyon Parish Rainbows Programme 2006/2007 RAINBOWS



Our Prefects 2006 - 2007



st. colmcille's parish

The depiction of the dove with the olive branch in its beak represents St. Colmcille, known as the "Dove of the Church". It also reminds us of Colmcille's last recorded words to his community which have universal and timeless application: "ut inter vos mutuam fictam habeatis cum pace" - "that you may have among yourselves mutual charity and peace".

The depiction of the water represents St. Colmcille's Well on the Ballycullen Road - the reason our parish is named after Colmcille. It also suggests the Springs of Carmel and the water of life.

Carmelite Friars have been serving Knocklyon Parish since its establishment in 1974, so the colour brown (the colour of the Carmelite habit) and the depiction of the Mountain and the Stars reflects this as well as the fact that as parishioners we are members of the wider Carmelite family. The Mountain in every Carmelite crest represents Mount Carmel in Israel, home of the prophets Elijah and Elisha, where the Carmelite story began in the dawning years of the 13th Century.

There are several interpretations of the stars, but the most common one sees the lower white star as a representation of Elijah, in whose spirit Carmelites have always endeavoured to live, while the two black stars above it represent the Lord Jesus and the Blessed Virgin Mary, to whose service Carmelites are dedicated.
