


## 8868 Pte. Patrick Murray

2nd Battalion, Irish Guards Killed in Action 16th September 1916 age 35 Attack on Ginchy










- 1: War Diary of the Irish Guards with actions of the 15th of September 1916. The first tanks ever to be used in battle were put into service on this date, and this is mentioned on this page of the diary. There is also a description: "Before the men had advanced 50 yards, the machine gun bullets began to work and [Irish Guards] casualties were heavy..."
- 2: Continuation page of the War Diary showing the 16th of September to have been relatively quiet.
- 3: Entry from the Register of Soldiers' Effects. This shows Pte. Murray succumbed to wounds, likely suffered the day before his death. Pte Murray was survived by his father, Christopher, who inherited the £4 3s 5d his son left.
- 4: Photo dated 15th September 1916; soldiers resting in a shell hole near Ginchy. (Imperial War Museum collection IWM (Q 4260).
- 5: 1901 Census return showing Patrick Murray's family. They lived in Rathfarnham Village. Both his and his father's professions are listed as "Sand Contractor". This would suggest they worked in one of Rathfarnham's quarries.
