

Foreword.

O every one of our readers the War Roll, which the Old Columban Society presents, must bring sadness. The price is heavy, even for the undying glory in which, as these pages prove, the College of St. Columba has claimed her share. The sympathy of all Columbans will go out to the parents, family, and friends of those whose names are here enshrined among the fallen. But for them, as for us all, the first and final thought will be pride—pride for the School which has taught her sons so well, and pride for the sons who have been so nobly true to her teaching.

The College of St. Columba has sent throughout her history a large proportion of her best to the Army and Navy; but it was something more than a military tradition which impelled many whose names stand on our list. They had caught the spirit of their School, and, therefore, they knew where duty lay.

Out of 880 Old Columbans living who entered S. C. C. since 1870 no less than 385 have found a way to serve. They came from the homeland, they came from the far ends of the earth, because their ears were open to the voice of honour. 65 Old Columbans and 5 ex-Masters have made the great sacrifice, and 2 have been reported as "missing"; 71 have been wounded, many of them more than once.

Emong the distinctions and decorations which have been won are the following:—C.B. (6), C.I.E. (1), C.M.G. (7), D.S.O. (24), Bar to D.S.O. (1), Legion of Honour (5), Croix de Guerre (5), Military Cross (30), Bar to Military Cross (1), Mentioned in Despatches (66). Truly a noble record, and while no pains have been spared to make the Roll complete, we ask pardon for any inadvertent omissions which may have occurred.




