CLONDALKIN.

Clondalkin, an inland parish and village, partly in Newcastle, but chiefly in Uppercross barony, Dublin county, 41 miles S.W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 4,777 acres, of which 44 are in the village. Population, 2,179; of village, 271, inhabiting 64 houses. It is situated near the ninth lock of the Grand Canal, and close to the line of the Great Southern and Western Railway, of which it is the first station from Dublin. It was anciently named Cluain-Dolcan, and by the Danes Dun-awley. The village consists chiefly of one irregular street, of small but neatly built cottages. The only public buildings are the Parish Church, a small plain modern building, a neat Roman Catholic Church, and a Public Library, erected through the munificence of Andrew Carnegie in 1910. It has Almshouses for destitute widows, a Dorcas Institution, Lying-in Hospital, and Dispensary, a Parochial and two National Schools, and a Constabulary Police Station. The ancient round tower is the nearest structure of the kind to the metropolis, and is in a state of good preservation. It stands 100 feet high; 15 feet in diameter, and is covered with a conical roof of stone.

CLONTARF AND DOLLYMOUNT.

AMALGAMATED WITH THE CITY OF DUBLIN BY ACT OF PARLIAMENT, 1900-FOR STREETS see CITY OF DUBLIN.

Clontarf, a maritime parish and formerly a township in Coolock barony, Dublin county, three miles E.N.E. from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 1,289 acres, of which 38 are occupied by the "sheds" of Clontarf. It is a memorable place in Irish history, as the scene of a great battle fought by King Brian Boromh, or Boru, on Good Friday, 1014, that put an end to the Danish power in Ireland, the details of which are variously and diffusively narrated by the native historians, and form, it is said, the subject of Gray's ode of the "Fatal Sisters." The High road skirts the strand, and off it branch many important roads and avenues, which are lined with villas and houses. The green lanes of Clontarf are

3 Holunes, Mrs., Pier hotel Lucan, an inland town and parish in Newcastle barony, Dublin county, seven miles W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 1,126 acres. Population, 919. It is partly the property of the Colthurst Vesey family, and partly the property of J. F. Shackleton, who have purchased the Petty Canon lands from the representatives of the late J. Ganon. The town is prettily situated in a fertile vale, on the banks of the River Liffey, which is here crossed by a fine stone bridge of one arch. The older portion of the town consists of one wide angular street of small but neat houses; there is also a number of fine residential houses in the neighbourhood. Its public buildings are, the Church of Ireland, a neat structure with a tower and spire, a large Roman Catholic Church, a Presentation Convent, a Methodist Church and Manse, and a Presbyterian Church and Manse. It has a Dispensary, a Lending Library, National Schools, and a Parochial Hall. It is a Chief Constabulary Police Station, and Petty Sessions are held every alternate Monday. In the grounds of Weston Lodge and Leixlip Castle is the well-known and much frequented waterfall, called the Salmon Leap, which consists of a succession of rock ledges crossing the Liffey, over which the fish dart at one bound. It forms a beautiful cascade, the picturesque effect of which is greatly increased by the rich and lofty wooded banks of the river, and the adjoining tastefully embellished demesne of Leixlip Castle. The Lucan spa is much frequented by visitors and invalids. A beautiful and capacious hotel and sanitorium has been completed by the "Lucan Hydropathic Spa Co., Limited." There is an electric railway from Dublin, Conyngham-road, to Lucan.

MALAHIDE.

Malahide, a maritime town and parish in Coolock barony, Dublin county, nine miles N. from Dublin, comprising an area of 1,126 acres. Population about 1,000. The town is situated on a narrow inlet of the sea, and on the Great Northern Railway. The Castle is a large square building, flanked by lofty circular towers, and stands on a high limestone rock, commanding a fine view of the town and bay.

Of the original Castle little remains but the site, and that has been greatly enlarged and improved; the principal front is embattled, and the main entrance, which is under a splendid Gothic porch, is defended by two circular towers. The grand hall is roofed with richly-carved ancient Irish oak, lighted by three large windows, with a gallery at the end. Among the many splendid apartments the Castle contains, the most curious is that called the "oak chamber," celled and wainscotted with richly-carved oak, in compartments, containing scriptural devices, and lighted with a pointed window of stained glass. In

MERRION-see PEMBROKE URBAN DISTRICT.

Merrion, a village in the parish of St. Mary, Donnybrook, Dublin barony and county, three miles S.R. by S. from the G.P.O., Dublin; comprising an area of 197 acres. It is situated on the road to Kingstowr and Bray, and fronts the strand of the bay of Dublin. Along the road to Blackrock, and in the neighbourhood around, there are various pretty seats and villas, among which are Elm-park, Bloomfield, Merrion-hall, and Merrion Castle, in the grounds of which latter are the ivied ruins of the Castle of the ancient proprietors. The Castle has been considerably enlarged, and is now known as St. Mary's Asylum for female blind. The parish church is situate at Simmonscourt, Donnybrook. The Merrion Promenade Pier and Salt Water Swimming Baths were creeted in 1883 at a cost of about £5,000.

MILLTOWN-see RATHMINES URBAN DISTRICT.

MONKSTOWN—see BLACKROCK AND KINGSTOWN URBAN DISTRICTS.

Monkstown, a maritime parish, partly in the barony of Dublin, but chiefly in that of Rathdown, Dublin county, five miles S.E. from the G.P.O., Dublin, comprising, with the town of Kingstown and the villages of Blackrock, Bullock, Glasthule, and Newtown, an area of 2,051 acres. It is delightfully situated on the south side of the bay of Dublin, and the rural portion embraces some of the most rich and varied landscapes; innumerable seats and villas, encircled in demesnes, or adorned with shrubberies and gardens, abound: other residences in beautiful terraces, front the sea. The parish Church, in the later English style, stands on the right of the road to Kingstown, and is an imposing if not a handsome structure; also St. John's Church, a Roman Catholic Church, and a Meeting-house of the Society of Friends. The Monkstown hospital, founded 1834, re-built, 1880, contains twenty beds, is supported by voluntary contributions, and receives patients without religious distinction. The Salthill hotel, an extensive establishment, is adjacent to the Salthill railway station, and commands fine views. There is also a railway station at Seapoint and a Postal and Telegraph Office.

PALMERSTOWN.

Palmerstown, or Palmerston, a parish and village in Uppercross barony, Dublin county, five miles west from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 1.518 acres. Population of the village, 186. It is situated on the river Lifley and road to Lucan. The village consists of neat cottages built by the County Council, and a Roman Catholic Chapel. The Great Southern and Western line of railway passes through the parish. In the vicinity there are several handsome seats and villas, the principal of which is Palmerstown House, a former seat of the Earl of Donoughmore, erected by his ancestor, the Right Hon. T. H. Hutchinson, when Secretary for Ireland. It is now occupied by the Stewart Institution. It is a spacious mansion on an elevated situation, commanding fine views. There is an electric tramway, which starts from Conyngham-road and runs to Lucan.

Ranelagh, a suburban district in the parish of St. Peter, Uppercross barony, Dublin county, two miles S.E. from the General Post Office, Dublin, comprising an area of 170 acres. It is situated on the road to Dundrum and Enniskerry. Here is a Carmelite Convent, with a neat Chapel, and a Methodist Church, also the Sandford Church of Ireland, built in 1826. There is a station on the Dublin and South-Eastern Railway here. About half a mile further on is Cullenswood, a village in the same parish and barony as Ranelagh, comprising an area of 118 acres. Electric Trams run to and from Sackville-street every five minutes.

RATHCOOLE AND SAGGART.

Rathcoole, an inland village and parish in Newcastle barony, Dublin county, 10 miles S.W. from Dublin, comprising an area of 4,705 acres. Population, 191. The village, which was anciently called Radcull, is situated upon the road to Naas, and consists of one street, about a quarter of a mile in length, chiefly of small houses, irregularly built. The only public building is the Church of Ireland Church, a neat plain edince. It has a Dispensary. It is the head station of the Constabulary force of the district of Uppercross. About two miles and a half N.W. from Rathcoole is the parish and village of Newcastle, comprising an area of 4,283 acres. Population, 1,108. It is situated on the Grand Canal. The village was formerly a borough, having a portrieve and burgesses under charter of James I., and prior to the Union, sent two members to the Irish Parliament. The Church of Ireland Church is an ancient picturesque edifice, having a fine eastern window. The Roman Catholic Church is a neat building, with a belfry. There is a Dispensary and National Schools. There is also a Postal Telegraph Office.

RATHFARNHAM.

Rathfarnham, a parish and village in Uppercross and Rathdown baronies, Dublin county, four miles south from the G.P.O., Dublin, comprising an area of 2,581 acres. Population, about 10,000. It is situated on the road to Whitechurch, and near where the Military-road commences that crosses the mountains into Wicklow county; population of village, 423. The village consists of one long irregular street; the Church of Ireland Church is on the right side. The Roman Catholic Church is a large building in the main street. The Loretto Convent, in the vicinity, is a modern building, attached to which there is an elegant chapel, a female free school, also a ladies' boarding and day school. The Novitiate College of the Augustinians and St. Columba's College are in the neighbourhood. There is also a Dispensary, a Petty Sessions Court-house. and Constabulary Police Station. Three fairs are held in the year-May 15, July 10, October 7. The bridge of Rathfarnham, over the river Dodder, is several hundred yards from the village, the approach to which is rising ground, thickly shaded in summer by the trees of the demesnes on each side. The neighbourhood abounds in pretty seats and villas, commanding rich views of the Dublin mountains and bay. At Grange is situated the "Priory," the residence of the famous John Philpot Curran. The castle of Rathfarnham was built by Archbishop Loftus in the reign of Elizabeth. One of the entrances to the demesne, fronting the Dodder, is in the style of a Roman triumphal arch. The entrance to the castle is by a portico of eight Doric columns that support a dome painted in fresco with the signs of the zodiac. Ballyboden, a village in the parish of Whitechurch, is about one and a quarter miles farther on, and comprises an area of two acres. Population, 154. There is a Postal and Telegraph Office in Rathfarnham.

RATHMINES AND RATHGAR URBAN DISTRICT.

Rathmines, an extensive district, suburban to the metropolis, in the parish of St. Peter, Uppercross, and Rathdown baronies, Dublin county, two miles south from the General Post Office, Dublin. It is situated on the road to Rathfarnham and Tallaght, and is one continued line of buildings, upwards of a mile and half in length, intersected by numerous terraces, with detached villas, and only separated from the city, at Portobello, by the Grand Canal, here crossed by La Touche's bridge, and where the municipal and parliamentary boundaries terminate. The Church of the Church of Ireland is dedicated to the Holy Trinity, and was rebuilt at a cost of £6,000. The Roman Catholic Church is a large and handsome structure, in the later style, and the principal one of the Union of St. Mary and St. Peter. There are

TALLAGHT.

Tallaght, an inland village and parish in Uppercross barony, Dublin county, seven miles S.W. by W. from G.P.O., Dublin, comprising an area of 21,868 acres. Population of parish, 4,921; of town, 232, inhabiting 65 houses. The town is situated on the road to Blessington, and the parish extends from the village of Templeogue to Crumlin, and on its southern side to Balrothery hill on the river Dodder, to the Green hills at its western extremity. The southern portion forms the range called the Tallaght Hill, and commands magnificent views of the bay and vale of Dublin. The Church, a little above the town, dedicated to St. Maelrune, is a modern building in the pointed style. At Firhouse there is a convent of Discalced Carmelites, and in the village is the Priory of the Dominican Order at St. Mary's, where a beautiful Memorial Church has been erected to the memory of the Very Rev. Thomas Burke. In the town there is a Dispensary, and there are National Schools. It is a Constabulary Police station, and Petty Sessions are held every alternate Monday. New Petty Sessions Court House erected by the County Council at a cost of over £1,000. There is a Postal and Telegraph Office. Mr. Robert Boardman's paper mill at Boldbrook is in the vicinity. The cars of the Dublin and Blessington Tramway Co., running between Terenure and Blessington, pass through Tallaght, which is a station on the line now running to Poulaphuca, a most interesting and charming line of country.
