## PATRICIANS

The monthly Patrician meeting took place as usual on Sunday 8th. Nov. when a full house discussed "The THOUGHTS OF MAO TSE-TUNG" A selection of his thoughts were published in Peking and this "LITTIE RED BOOK" is the Bible of the Maoists. It should be borne in mind that the version available here is specially produced and "doctored" for the western market and that the selections are carefully chosen from the many speeches and writings of Mao over the past 40-50 years.

There are significant gaps in the little red book --. God is rarely mentioned, as would be expected from a Marxist-Ieninist. Nothing is said of the vast purges in the early fifties in which many millions perished, or the regime's efforts to set up a controlled National Catholic Church which failed. Naturally the failures are overlooked.

Some felt we could "baptise"Mao and use some of his ideas to tackle some of the social problems here. No doubt we have many genuine problems, human and otherwise : housing, industry, real poverty, low standard of living of many, emikration etc. Mao has got things moving -- four fifths of Red China's 750 million work in the countryside six days a week at the crops or at land improvement and yet they eat less than most of the world's peoples.

There is a lot of good common sense in Mao's ideas. In 1945 the party and the government accepted his views as the official policy Of the country and they are taught the way the catechism was taught here a few years ago. Each person must study Mao until it becomes part of himself. Mao has great confidence in the ability of his thought to change the whole world and this is what is happening .

Christianity also hopes to change the world. Some say that after 1000 years it has failed, where it has not yet been tried ! Mao insists again and again on the need to link theory with practise ------ THIS WOUID MAKE US SAINTS •

As a footnote it is worth mentioning that a number of violent Maoists in the citynhave recently returned to the faith as a result of Legion apostolate towards that group.
