FIRST YEARS SETTLE IN



ST. COLMCILLE'S COMMUNITY SCHOOL

As our front page photos indicate, our eagerly awaited Community School opened its doors for business on 4th September. Below Principal John McKennedy describes the atmosphere on that first momentous day in the life of the parish.

It was with great excitement that the first students of St. Colmcille's Community School assembled in front of the school together with parents and teachers on the morning of Monday, 4th September. The teaching staff had been working for the previous week preparing for the big day. After the video-recording and photographs were taken by parents and teachers, the time had come to cross the threshold and 120 students, 11 teaching staff and the secretary said good-bye to the outside world and entered the wonderful world of St. Colmcille's Community School.

We all assembled in the architecturally unique library where the teaching staff was introduced to the students. A short but moving service was conducted by Fr. Martin Baxter, the School Chaplain and Ms. Kelly our Music, RE and Maths Teacher. I, as Principal, lit a large candle representing the light into the future and four other candles were lit by the Tutors of each of the classes, Mr. O'Brien for Class 1B, Ms. Kerins for Class 1K, Mr. Smith for Class 1S and Ms. Kelly for Class 1Y.

The classes were formed on the basis of ensuring a gender balance and an average spread of abilities. Ms, Hackett, the Deputy Principal, then called out the class lists and each group in turn went with their tutor to their classrooms, to get their timetables, receive general instructions but most especially to begin friendships that will last for many years to come. During the past three weeks we have begun to get to know each other. Already a happy caring atmosphere has developed. The dedicated and energetic team of teachers are delighted with the work-like response of all students to their lessons. Ms. Callaghan, the Languages Teacher, has already commented on her students' abilities to absorb both French and German so quickly. Home Economics students have already begun their first project with their teacher Ms. Barton on 'Healthy Diets', and Mr. Munnelly, our Technology teacher says the students are very enthusiastic and excited about their Technology class. Ms. Dinet, Our Art Teacher, is also a fluent French speaker, so who knows, Art through French is a real possibility!

The building programme is progressing well. Mr. David Duggan of Duggan Brothers has been extremely helpful and is working very hard to ensure the fully equipped Science Labs will be ready for the end of September. Ballyboden St. Enda's GAA Club has been very supportive and is helping with the development of the playing fields. It is also providing facilities for our home matches. Knocklyon United is also providing its facilities for the school for which we are most grateful.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Interim Board of Management for its invaluable support to me personally and for their commitment to the school particularly during these past busy six months. I would also like to commend the parents of our first students for their vision and confidence in this new school. All students have their full complement of books and their uniforms are a source of daily admiration, which is indeed great credit to the parents.

Finally, on behalf of the Community of Knocklyon, I welcome our highly qualified and professional team of teachers (pictured below) to St. Colmcille's Community School. They bring a wide range of experiences from a variety of educational backgrounds and I look forward to working with them, the pupils and parents in the years ahead.

I watched as John McKennedy (Principal), with his teachers, greeted the first two pupils, who I have to say will never have a more welcoming first

After writing and campaigning for so long for this day, I was genuinely moved at the pleasant sight of so many of the local children walking to school with most of their classmates from St. Colmcille's National School. It looked so natural, and yet it will have such a positive impact on the social environment in Knocklyon.

Since that day I have had many people enquiring as to when the formal opening (and celebrations) will take place. I look forward with great anticipation for the opportunity to thank as many as possible of the hundreds, maybe thousands, who supported the campaign for this school throughout its twenty year history and I am confident that a community celebration will be discussed as soon as is feasible after the completion of the building. He returns to Knocklyon as a member of the parish team, Chaplain to the new Community School and Prior to the Carmelite Community here. We extend him a warm welcome and wish him well in his new role among us.

A Hike with a Difference







Idrone House, a landmark opposite the entrance to Superquinn Shopping Centre, was put up for auction by Douglas Newman Good on September 21.

This impressive double-fronted residence has been a prominent feature of Knocklyon since the middle of the 19th Century. Two huge trees in the large front garden frame the wide two-storev facade. Inside the accommodation includes three reception rooms and five bedroom. Many of the original architectural features have been preserved. It is a listed building and consequently alterations are restricted but full planning permission has already been obtained for the building of a new fourbedroomed house on part of the site.


