

New Choir Director

We would like to extend a very warm welcome to Denis Morgan, our new choir director in charge of the Eleven O'Clock Choir.

I met him recently, a charming man with a good sense of humour. Born in Portlaoise, he is the eldest of seven children (he has 2 brothers and 4 sisters).

From childhood there has always been music in his life.

His mother was a singer and played the piano. His father held a singing class, and the family was always involved in any musical event in the town. No wonder then, that when he finished his secondary education, music was his first choice.

He came to Dublin and entered U.C.D. to study music and English. After graduation he began a teaching career in secondary schools.

It was in Dublin too that he met and married his wife Maria. Their first home was on the Navan Road, but in 1988 they moved to Templeroan where their twins Niamh and Killian were born.

Denis is a full-time teacher of music and English at St. Benildus College, Stillorgan. He started a choir there, originally for Church reasons, but soon the orchestra and choir were entering competitions in the musical section of Feis Maitiú and gaining splendid results.

Then came the musical productions: 'Joseph And His Amazing Coloured Dreamcoat', 'Smike', 'Nicholas Nickleby' and 'Oliver'. The choir and orchestra came into their own under the direction of Denis. He is also the Minister of CYMS Terenure Choir who present a Christmas Concert every year, and also sings with the Guinness Choir.

Choir conducting is very close to Denis's heart. he has studied this subject with John O'Connor's Cork School of Music, with Louis Halsey at Canford Summer School, just outside London and more recently with James Jordan from Westminster College, New Jersey, who held a course in Dublin.

He is looking forward to working with the choir and who knows what exciting things lie ahead.

You may think Denis is a workaholic, but yes, he

does have hobbies – swimming, badminton, tennis, theatre and travelling in Europe and other lesser known places. This year it was Sweden, in a delightful area north of Stockholm.

Like all choir members Denis would hope that the choir will continue to attract new members into its ranks. There will be a great welcome for any new recruits who come along to the Wednesday night practice at 8 p.m. in the Tory Room in the Church.

Bishop James Kavanagh 1914-2002

Following the recent death of Bishop James Kavanagh, Anna Brioscú shares with us memories of a special friendship since her early childhood.

On Friday, August 9, 2002, at the conclusion of morning prayer Fr. David asked us to pray for the soul of Bishop James Kavanagh, who had gone to Eternal Life the previous evening. I was shocked and saddened at this news. I had known James Kavanagh for about sixty years. He was a curate in the newly established parish of St. Agnes in Crumlin when I was a young child. This was not an easy posting for any of the priests, especially during the war years (1939-1945). As usual some good does emerge. From late 1940 there were no private cars allowed so priests and laity had to take to their bicycles or shank's mare. This was a great blessing as it built up a spirit of community in this fledgling widespread parish. Fr. Kavanagh was one who would alight from his bike to bid his parishioners the time of day and in this way got to know people.

His academic successes have been well documented in the various obituaries published after his death but I knew him as a caring priest, a true Dubliner who was totally in touch with the poor and the deprived. When I was in Sixth Year in secondary school he was attached to St. Andrew's Parish, Westland Row. On a Friday he or the late Fr. Percy Perkins would come in to give us a talk for about half an hour instead of the regular religious knowledge class. Neither of these men were great lecturers and were very different personalities. Fr. Kavanagh spoke to us on social issues of the time, quietly and practically getting his message across to about twenty teenagers.

I remember him coming to visit my parents in his army uniform. A soldier with a Roman collar was a strange sight to us youngsters.

He celebrated Mass with us on the occasion of my parent's silver wedding anniversary. Archbishop Dermot Ryan was indeed fortunate when he secured Dr. Kavanagh as one of his auxiliary bishops in the Dublin diocese. James Kavanagh was a fluent Irish speaker and was looked upon at the time as a

Godsend by the newly established Gaelscoileanna. He confirmed the youngest of our children in the Pro-Cathedral shortly after his ordination as bishop. He was present at my father's funeral Mass in 1974. He was a very busy man but never lost contact with his friends. There was always the phone call of congratulations or condolence over the years. On 1st January last he phoned to wish us a happy New Year and to say how much he liked our Christmas card. He sounded the same Jim Kavanagh as of sixty years ago. That was the last time I spoke to him.

With Bishop Kavanagh's passing goes the last priest who served in Crumlin during my youth in St. Agnes parish. Fr. Cronan Byrne pre-deceased him by a few months.

James Kavanagh was the most Christlike person I have had the privilege of knowing. He was staunch in his support for prisoners, especially those unfortunate enough to have been wrongfully detained, and for anyone whom he felt was being unfairly treated by those in authority. There was a poignant reminder at his graveside in Glasnevin on Monday 12 August, in the person of Nicky Kelly paying his last respects to a brave churchman and friend.

LOCAL DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY

The South Dublin County Development Board was established in March 2000 as part of the Local Government Reform Process. Membership of the Board, which is chaired by John Hannon, M.C.C., consists of representatives of Local Government, Local Development, State Agencies and Social Partners. The initial task of the board was to prepare a ten year strategy for social, cultural and economic developments.

Commenting on the findings, John Hannon said that the research confirmed that residents feel that the area has improved over the past five years, with the vast majority (77%) indicating that South County Dublin as a whole offers a good quality of life, with 73% saying that it was a good place for children to grow up, and 64% believing that it has strong local communities. Facilities such as education, shopping, banking and post offices are well regarded while matters of concern are traffic, public transport, affordable housing, youth facilities and safety. Aspirations for the next five years include more recreational facilities for young people (26%), better roads (23%) and keeping the area clean (12%).

The population of South County Dublin is almost 240,000, 5.2% over 65 years. There are 3,500 businesses in the county including 10 of the top 100 and two international business parks (City West and Grange Castle) within the area. According to the survey 65% of the population believe that there are good employment opportunities.

The KCC will soon be in contact with the Parks section of South Dublin County Council to highlight the various 'black spots' in the area that needs cleaning up. If there are any areas in your estate or close by that are unsightly please contact any member of the KCC and we will pass on the information. In passing I would like to compliment two very young men in Delaford who went round the houses and collected the funds for a strimmer and are keeping the area well trimmed. Well done to Michael and Shane, you are a great example for the young people of Knocklyon and hopefully more will follow your example.

Whilst the 'illegal campsites' are still a major problem in South Dublin, thankfully Knocklyon appears to be faring out well at the moment. The SDCC used their own bye-law to move the illegal campsite on the Firhouse Road and thankfully there were no major litter problems comparable to last year.

Cllr. John Lahart has been working closely with the representatives from South Dublin Co. Council on improved signage in the general area of Knocklyon. We, along with Cllr. Lahart, are requesting the NRA to include Knocklyon on the Motorway signs and to improve signage to the various areas within Knocklyon on the slip roads. The lack of signage is causing major problems to people visiting the area so the KCC will be keeping the pressure on

We are also glad to hear from the Gardaí in Rathfarnham that things have been relatively quiet in the area over the summer. Long may this continue. However, we ask the residents of Knocklyon to remain vigilant and to note any suspicious activities taking place within the area. It is important for the Gardaí to have correct statistics for the level of crime and anti-social behaviour in the area, so, in order to do this, keep a note of anything you may feel warrants informing the Gardaí.

Finally, the KCC would like to compliment all the young people of Knocklyon for their participation in the various sports activities in the area. Large numbers of children took part in the various summer camps in Ballyboden St. Endas and the number of young soccer players on the Delaford pitches is fantastic to see. We should all encourage these activities and give support wherever possible to the various sports clubs involved.

Don't forget to fill out your 'Special Olympics Form' inviting relatives of those taking part into your home during the games next June. The 31st August deadline has been extended and forms are available in Superguinn or from the secretary of the KCC.


BALLYBODEN ST. ENDAS GAA. CAMOGIE AND LADIES FOOTBALL CLUB


Player of the Camp - Dylan Soon accepts his prize from Dublin



Another school year has begun introducing many changes.

The profile of the Junior School has been changed forever by the development of our new car park, playground and traffic management facilities. Children and their parents now have a really safe approach route to St. Colmcille's. The success of the project owes great credit to the Boards of Management, the Department of Education and Science, architect Louis Burke and contractor S.M. Morris. A special tribute is due to the caretakers and ancillary staff of both schools under the guidance of Mr. Francis Connolly, deputy principal of the Senior School, who have provided stewarding while we awaited completion of the work. Many thanks also to all of the children, parents and members of the community who have co-operated with the new safety measures. We express gratitude to everyone who remained patient throughout the 10 week contract, especially those using the Community Centre and Iona Centre. We hope the work did not cause too much inconvenience during the Summer.

180 new Junior Infants arrived on the first schoolday of September and were greeted eagerly by our six teachers, Ms. H. Mulqueen, N. Moloney, P. Callaghan, S. Ebbs, O. Boland and H. Dore. They have settled in well to their newly furnished and decorated classrooms (see Page 22).

Our teaching staff has been increased to 34 after the arrival of Ms. Evelyn Neary, Room 15, and Ms. Niamh Moloney, Room B. Both teachers are newly qualified and are warmly welcomed to St. Colmcille's. Past pupil Ms. Susanne Beattie has also joined the staff as a resource teacher, while Helen Dore and Olivia Boland have been granted permanent

status. Sadly our assistant principal, Ms. Ita McDonald, who has taught here since the school opened, will retire at the beginning of October. One of our most experienced teachers of Infants, the jovial Ita, will be missed by one and all. We wish her many happy years of retirement, and thank her for her wonderful contribution to early childhood education in Knocklyon.

During First Term various classes can look forward to special events and activities like the Irish Times Music in The Classroom Concert at D.C.U., the Compromise Rules matches at Croke Park, swimming and gymnastic classes, football and hurling coaching. Each class has been provided with new computers, printers and software as a result of our very successful sponsored walk last Easter. We will host parent-teacher meetings in November and look forward to involving parents in school life throughout the year.

Those wishing to enrol pupils to begin Junior Infants next year should be aware that December 20th is the closing date for applications. Applicants born during the summer months may have to wait until after their 5th birthday to begin at St. Colmcille's. Application forms are available in the school office. Indeed it is not too early to enrol children who intend to enter between now and 2007.

We are still awaiting news on our application for much needed additional permanent classrooms at the school. Hopefully the development will be included in the Department of Education and Science's plans for 2003. With only 16 permanent classrooms hosting 34 teachers, 14 of whom teach in prefabs, it is beyond time for the Department to provide the extra accommodation we require.

Changes to Enrolment Procedures

We are delighted with the level of interest in our school. At present, the demand for places exceeds the capacity of the school (650 pupils). This means that it is necessary to prioritise amongst the applicants. In broad terms priority is generally given to children with a brother or sister in the school, then to other children from the catchment area. When can I apply?






Nuala Breathnach is our president and can be contacted at 493 0124. John Davis continues to be our able treasurer. We would welcome a big influx of new members.


